

"Lord, let me know my end, and what is the measure of my days; let me know how fleeting my life is. You have made my days a few hand-breadths, and my lifetime is as nothing in your sight. Surely everyone stands as a mere breath." Psalm 39:4-5

This passage from Psalms, as well as the events in my life the last couple of months, reminds me in a strong way that time marches on and things change. Things are different now. Time marches ever on.

I am grateful for the ministry we share. As we begin our September together, I feel even more aware that these changes I have noted in my life, also have counterpoints in yours. Some of the changes we share in common, others are just yours or mine alone. Yet, somehow, when we gather back together, the spirit moves among us, and the spirit moves through us, and...God is good. Things are different now. Time marches on.

CLASSES FOR ADULTS

The education hour is a great time to meet and get to know a smaller group of your church family. Visitors are always welcome in every class! This fall, we have two options for adults during the education hour:

1. Back to Basics

Every week join Pastor Clark to meet one of your spiritual ancestors. You will be amazed to find that they are a lot like you. Some were heroes, some were villains but most were just everyday folks that we can learn so much from. Hear the stories of these men and women called by God to do amazing things and see how they fit into the larger narrative of our faith story.

2. Digging into our Methodist Roots

John Wesley loved God and loved people. He organized Methodist Societies to provide an avenue for believers to engage more effectively in matters of social action. Wesley was concerned with many issues of social justice including slavery, prison reform, education and the rights of the poor and of women. Early Methodist leaders followed closely in his footsteps and established our social principals. As we look to make our way forward as faithful followers of Jesus Christ and maintain our Methodist heritage we need to revisit our roots.

Join Jenny to explore Wesley's three simple rules for living the Christian life and the five means of grace that Wesley called "instituted," meaning that they are spiritual practices in which Jesus himself participated and which he encouraged his followers to do. One of the beautiful aspects of Wesley's theology is that spiritual practices are seamlessly integrated with practices of loving our neighbors well. This is why Wesley said there is no holiness but social holiness. A life of genuine prayer inevitably leads to a life of hospitality, mercy, and justice.



You are invited to participate in a two-day training event for those starting out as a Lay Servant, and those who are continuing their work as Lay Servants Friday, October 6 from 6 pm to 8:30 pm AND Saturday, October 7 from 8:30 am to 3:30 pm at Rockport UMC. Registrants are required to attend both days.

- The Basic Course offering is Lay Servant Ministries and is intended for those new to Lay Servant Training and those who have not taken a course in 3 years or more. The book we will be using is Lay Servant Ministries: Basic Course by Sandy Jackson with Brian Jackson.
- The Advanced Course offering *Leading in Prayer* is intended for those who have taken a Basic Course in the last 3 years and are active as a Lay Servant. The book we will be using is *Let the Whole Church Say Amen* by Laurence Hull Stookey.

Cost is \$35 which includes books, materials, and meals. There will be a light dinner offered on Friday, and a continental breakfast and lunch offered on Saturday.

Brecksville United Methodist Church Board of Trustees Special Report



Last year the congregation generously agreed to set up a **Planned Expense Fund** (**PEF**) for taking care of the Church building and parsonage. The PEF is a really different approach, enabling the Trustees to proactively address repairs and replacements, rather than just responding from emergency to emergency. The generous funding in place has allowed Trustees to make plans for dealing with expected expenses on these wonderful assets. The Trustees have a schedule of expected expenses over the next 15 years, which is posted on our **BUMC website** for all to see!

This year Trustees had budgeted for about \$31,000 in PEF repairs and expenditures. That included doing a significant water drainage project at the parsonage to solve a water problem. As with any budget some surprises have occurred.

The parsonage project grew significantly when we discovered that the back yard water drainage problem had actually damaged the basement walls. So the Trustees juggled their other 2017 planned work and received approval from the new Church Council to spend an additional \$7,770 from the PEF for the basement wall repairs.

Pictures of all the work at the Parsonage to solve the water and basement problems are attached. The parsonage is about 50 years old. These repairs were necessary and protect our equity in the parsonage as well as make the parsonage more functional for Pastor Stein and his family.

We have postponed some planned 2017 projects in order to prioritize the parsonage work. The PEF has worked as intended, and provided a means to do both planned work and address an immediate need.

We are closely monitoring other needs, and we have successfully completed a number of projects with volunteer labor and donated materials. Did you notice all the freshly painted exterior entry ways and beautiful new landscaping?

Trustees continue to look at what needs to be done and what funds we have to do the necessary work, being the best stewards we can of our assets.

Trustees truly appreciate our congregation's continued support of our efforts. If you are currently contributing to the PEF, *THANK YOU!* And if you would like join us by starting to contribute to the Planned Expense Fund, we invite you to call the Church Office to start your contributions today.

Landscaping Update

If you have not noticed the new landscaping I suggest you take a stroll around the grounds of the Church when you get a chance. The landscaping along with East side of the Church, around the steps going up to the front yard and around the sign has been updated. The landscaping had gotten overgrown and tired. It is now new and fresh. And look at those benches....have a seat and enjoy the view.

This work was done with all volunteer labor and private donations. No budget money was used. The landscape was designed to be beautiful but also as low maintenance as practical.

In order to help maintain the beauty and keep the landscaping fresh it takes a lot of work. Every little bit helps. If you would like to help with weeds, or trimming, or with the spring and fall cleanups your help is appreciated. If you would like to "adopt" a part of the landscape to maintain that would be wonderful. Let us know what section you want to call "your own".

Middle School Youth Group will meet on Tuesdays


