Philippians 4:4-7 Celebrate God all day, every day. I mean, revel in him! Make it as clear as you can to all you meet that you're on their side, working with them and not against them. Help them see that the Master is about to arrive. He could show up any minute! ...

Dr. Hugh McKean of Chengmai, Thailand, tells of a church of four hundred members where every member tithes. They receive a weekly wage of forty stangs (less than twenty cents) and their rice. Of this meager existence, each gives a tenth every week. Because of this, they have done more for Christ in Thailand than perhaps any other church. They pay their own preacher and have sent two missionary families to spread the gospel in a community cut off from the outside world. They are intensely interested in all forms of Christian work, especially work for unfortunates of every kind; and their gifts for this kind of work are large. They have not only accepted Christ, but, having found him good, they are making him known to others. Oh, by the way, this church of all tithers is also a church of all lepers—every person has leprosy.

We come to November, a month that holds much celebration for us. We will come together around All Saints Day, and a Veterans Day Sunday. Then we move on into Thanksgiving and the beginnings of our Advent and Christmas celebrations. We have so much for which to be thankful. It has always been my experience that those who have little seem to be able to share just about everything they've got. As blessings grow, we often get confused into believing that they came our way by our own efforts, and therefore are uniquely ours to enjoy. My prayer for all of us in this wonderful month of thanks, is that we will remain humbled and grateful for all that God has given. So much so, that we will be moved to share more of what we have that others might come to know Jesus, and experience his love for them through our generosity.

I thank God for all of you, and for this incredible journey we share. May we respond according to the many ways we have been blessed.



Searching for Jesus: Opening Ourselves to the Presence of God

We are moving into that time of year that can be filled with extra stress and a flurry of activities from holiday parties to shopping to travel. As the days grow darker and colder we invite you to engage in a deeper sort of activity. The Advent practice of hope-filled waiting calls us to immerse ourselves in a place somewhere between patience and joyful expectation.

You will have the opportunity during the 10 o'clock Sunday Education hour for the five Sundays before Christmas to consider your own journey in Advent. Where is there darkness in waiting? Where is light in things that bring you hope? We are excited to invite three spiritual directors who bring very different gifts to our church. Spend some time learning from them as you find space to be quiet and rest in promises we will find together.



November 20— Liz Nau, a retired United Methodist pastor, and a graduate of the Ignatian Spirituality Institute at John Carroll University, will teach us how to get the most out of a labyrinth walk. Liz is a Veriditis certified labyrinth facilitator and has presented labyrinth programs for individuals and groups. Liz un-

derstands that life is a pilgrimage and has felt the call to companion others as they walk more deeply into their faith and to help others know and experience God's love and Christ's presence in daily life.



November 27—Sr. Marian Durkin will lead us through Ignatian Gospel Contemplation. The early Christians did not waste a lot of energy looking back and wishing they had been born a hundred years earlier so they could have walked with Jesus. Instead they focused on coming to know Christ in three powerful

ways: through the sharing of the meal, through the stories that were told, and through the power of the Spirit when they gathered in Christ's name. Immerse yourself in the ancient and powerful prayer practice that allows you to use your senses to make the Gospel real and come alive in your time of quiet prayer.

Sister Marian has been a spiritual director for over ten years. She directs group retreats at the Jesuit Retreat House in Parma and guides individuals in Spiritual Direction. She has helped direct Busy Student Retreats each year for Kent State University and at Case Western Reserve University. Sister is also involved with Samaritan Women and Ohioans to Stop Executions. She was a co-founder of The Open House, a ministry for those afflicted with AIDS and their families. She continues her ministry to Gay and Lesbian Catholics with a yearly retreat.



December 4 – Rev. Sharon Seyfarth Garner will guide us through Lectio Divina, a method of prayer that dates back to the early monastic tradition. Imagine a time when Bibles were rare and many people could not read. Monks gathered in the chapel to hear a member of the community

read scripture. In this exercise they were taught to listen with their hearts and reflect on what they heard God saying to them.

Sharon describes herself as a "Martha" in our fast-paced world, longing for more "Mary" moments to slow down, sit at the feet of Jesus and simply spend time with God on purpose. Her special areas of interest include lectio divina, centering prayers and the spiritual exercises of St. Ignatius. She is the author of *Praying with Mandalas: A Colorful, Contemplative Practice* and enjoys contemplative coloring as a spiritual practice offering focus, joy and depth to times of prayer.

December 11—Liz Nau return to teach us the art of Centering Prayer, a method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of prayer in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship. Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer. Rather, it adds depth of meaning to all prayer and facilitates the movement from more active modes of prayer — verbal, mental or affective prayer — into a receptive prayer of resting in God.

December 18—Take what you have learned these past four weeks and guide yourself through multiple prayer and devotion stations that will be set up around the church. The stations will remain in place through Christmas Eve. You could also use this time to sit quietly and talk to God using one of the techniques you learned this month.

National Donor Sabbath is November 13: There are nearly 120,000 men, women and children in the United States who are awaiting an organ transplant. Of that number, thousands are right here in Ohio. Every 10 minutes a new name is added to the national transplant waiting list. On average, 18 people

die every day from the lack of available organs.

Consistent with the Great Commandment to love God with all our heart, soul and mind, and our neighbors as ourselves (Matthew 22:37-39), self-less consideration for the health and welfare of all people is at the heart of the Christian ethic. Each year, our church joins others in observing the ecumenical and interfaith celebration of the National Donor Sabbath. United Methodists are encouraged to consider becoming future organ and tissue donors and to encourage others to learn about it.

Organ and tissue donation is a life-giving act. Transplantation of organs and tissues is scientifically proven to save the lives of people with terminal diseases and improve the quality of life for the blind, the deaf, those with life-threatening illnesses.


