This, Our Season Rev. Clark. Stein, Senior Pastor

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. - Ecclesiastes 3:1

One of the most interesting aspects of traveling to the Holy Land is the opportunity to walk the streets that Jesus walked. There are some powerful experiences in that venture, as one can be reasonably certain that the place is THE PLACE. Perhaps the most powerful of these places to me is the village of Capernaum. One is able to visit the ruins of the village beside the Sea of Galilee. You can see the ruins of Peter's house. One can visit the site of the synagogue where Jesus healed the man with the withered hand, and where he openly taught the crowds and the disciples. You can walk on the remains of the streets, view carvings in stone that date back to the time of Jesus, and stand beside the sea imagining sights of fishing boats and nets and walking on water. Capernaum was Jesus' adopted home town, the very center of his ministry in the Galilee region. It was a bustling, alive city on those beautiful shores.

Today it is merely a ruin. No one lives in the city anymore. It is long since abandoned. It is a place of such significance to those of our faith. Capernaum housed Jesus and the disciples. Its citizens witnessed miracles within the confines of the town. They saw lives forever changed. The ruins now stand as a memorial to a different time, a different season. The town of Capernaum at that point in history served a vital function and purpose. It welcomed Jesus, and allowed him to stay there. In its season, Capernaum was a shining beacon of hope and welcome. But its season turned, and people abandoned the village. It was a mist that appeared for a short time and then vanished.

We are in the middle of the season of our business once again. May we be ever aware that this is our season. This is our time to be a beacon of hope and welcome in an inhospitable world. Who knows what the future holds? Brecksville may be another Capernaum in the years to come. We know that we seem to be changing from what we once were. May we be faithful in this, our season. May those who hear stories of us in years to come also be able to affirm, in our ruins if that be God's will, that we were faithful in our season. May they affirm that we willingly housed the Christ, and that we saw and participated in all of the many miracles of life in an inclusive faith community. May we just be faithful that one day these rocks will speak loudly about faith and devotion, and rising to the top of our potential as a community of faith in our season of life.
