Gramma's Hard Tack Candy

I love holiday family traditions.

One of my favorite traditions growing up was when we would go over to my Gramma's house the Saturday after Thanksgiving and make hard tack candy. We gathered in Gramma's kitchen and would make a dozen different flavors, ranging from cinnamon (my favorite) and spearmint, to watermelon and peach. (We never made peppermint because Gramma said it made everything else taste like peppermint.) By the end of the day, we were all covered in powdered sugar and our fingers were sore from handling and cutting the hot candy.

It was a day I looked forward to every year.

But then, eight years ago, my Gramma suddenly got sick and passed away the week before Christmas. The last time we had seen her was when we made hard tack.

When Thanksgiving rolled around the next year, no one was ready to continue the tradition without Gramma—it just wouldn't be the same without her, in her farmhouse kitchen, with the red and white checkered tablecloth.

Then, people moved away, life got busy, and years went by. We still haven't made hard tack without Gramma.

But, this year, I finally said to my mom, "I want to do hard tack again. We can have it at my house. It won't be the same, but I think Gramma will be there with us in spirit." She agreed, so I told others, and everyone was excited to bring back this tradition. Then I told my son, and he excitedly said, "We are?!" and then, with tears in his eye, "Oh, I miss Gramma."

The last time we made hard tack he was 4 years old. And yet he still remembers.

That's what traditions do: they pass on joy and love, from generation to generation.

This Advent and Christmas season, we are going to remember the people and stories of the first Christmas, and celebrate how the good news that was birthed transcends time and space: it's for the whole world, *from generation to generation*. We'll continue traditions from the past, and create new ones, so that generations to come will know of the love and joy of that first Christmas.

As I write this, I'm mentally preparing for my house to be covered in powdered sugar in about a week. Then I think of Gramma's smile. And I know that the day will also be covered in love and joy and memories.

But don't worry, Gramma, we still won't make peppermint.





2022 North Central Jurisdictional Conference

On November first, I traveled to Fort Wayne, Indiana to participate in the North Central Jurisdictional Conference. (Quick recap: in the United Methodist Church, local churches are gathered into Annual Conferences, and Conferences are gathered into Jurisdictions. Then, all Jurisdictions and Central Conferences—those outside the US—are gathered into the General Conference, which is the worldwide United Methodist Church.)

The primary work of Jurisdictional Conference is to elect bishops who will itinerate (move around) within the Jurisdiction. Jurisdictions also vote on resolutions, pass a budget, and do other such work.

This was my first time being a delegate to Jurisdictional Conference, elected by clergy in our Annual Conference to represent East Ohio in this larger context. I really didn't know what to expect, but became nervous as I heard about all the politicking that is typically done to elect bishops, and considered the current environment of division within the UMC.

However, what I encountered was something very different. As we gathered in the Convention Center, we were greeted by the Holy Spirit. Each day began with worship, setting the tone for business sessions filled with voting to elect three bishops, discussing and eventually passing three resolutions, and having holy conversation on the topics of White Supremacy and gun violence, and homophobia and transphobia in the Church. Especially on days when we were having these holy, yet difficult conversations, "business" and worship converged, as scripture and singing were woven throughout.

Yes, there were people who refused to participate in the hard conversations, and that is their right. And yes, there was the back-and-forth of speeches "for" and "against" resolutions. But even in the midst of these disagreements, the Holy Spirit was felt.

And when the week was over, I was left with an overwhelming sense of hope for The United Methodist Church, and most of all for God's Church universal.

Yes, churches have chosen to disaffiliate, and that will continue to happen for the next couple of years. However, let's not think too highly of ourselves—the church is *much bigger* than The United Methodist Church, and God is *much more powerful* than our fear or anger or frustration with one another.

These words from Bishop Julius Trimble have stuck with me: "We can press on – or be a footnote in the annals of history, so I stopped by to tell you that *Jesus is real!* You may consider yourself left-leaning or right-leaning, but we all better be leaning on the everlasting arms!"




