Pastor Heidi Checks In

I love the Easter story as it's told in the Gospel of John. The fact that Mary doesn't see Jesus—even though he's standing right in front of her face—until he calls her by name.

When someone uses our name, it's like they're catering everything they're saying to us—it's personal and special. When Jesus stands in front of Mary at the empty tomb, it's as if he's saying, "Mary, I came back for you! I promised you I would return, and I did, because I love you!"



I've read this scripture many times over the years, but this year it hit deeper, because our eldest (Joseph) now goes by the name Jordan.

He came to us about a year and a half ago and told us that he wanted to be called Jordan. It's a non-binary name, meaning it's both a traditional "boy" name and a traditional "girl" name.

At first, Rus and I weren't sure what to make of it. We talked to Jordan, telling him, "We understand you're trying to figure yourself out, and sometimes a name can be part of that. We will love you no matter what name you decide to go by. We're going to continue to call you Joseph, because we don't want you to feel like you have to keep the name Jordan, even if eventually you decide it doesn't fit. It's fine if others want to call you Jordan, though."

After a few months, I shared with Dana Schwendeman, our Youth Director, about Joseph/Jordan, and how Rus and I didn't really understand it. And her response to me was, "You don't need to understand it for it to be valid and important to him." And the frankness and truthfulness with which she spoke, struck me.

Well, fast-forward several more months, and Joseph still wanted to go by the name Jordan. His friends were calling him Jordan, his teachers were emailing me about Jordan, and Corrie even started calling him Jordan.

One day, I was standing in our kitchen, and I said, "blah, blah, blah, blah Jordan." I don't remember the sentence, but I do remember Jordan's reaction. He stopped in his tracks, turned toward me with a huge smile on his face and tears in his eyes and, and said, "Mom! You called me Jordan! Thank you!!" And he gave me a huge squeeze-of-a-hug.

I told him, "Kid, I've always loved you." And he responded, "Yes, but now I know it more."

I imagine Mary looking at Jesus the same way Jordan looked at me that day in the kitchen: stopped in her tracks, eyes wide and filled with tears, and an expression of joy and astonishment on her face.

So, from that day on, I've called "Joseph" Jordan (with a few slip-ups here and there). If calling him by another name shows him that I love him and support him no matter what, then it's a change I'll gladly make.

If you're willing, I'd be honored if you called him Jordan, too, and show him that here at Brecksville United Methodist Church, we really do love you, even if and no matter what.

Just like Jesus.

Lectio Divina Mondays at 10:30 am/Tuesdays at 7 pm

You've seen the announcement for Lectio Divina over the past three years. Have you wondered about it? Who attends? What do we do there? Why do we have it in the first place? The honest truth, we are not doing Lectio Divina in its most ancient form or method. What we are doing is more of a combination of Lectio with a heavy emphasis on Imaginative Prayer - another ancient practice. The leader reads a select story from the Bible and you spend 5 minutes with God using your imagination to picture the scene and place yourself within it. We share as we are comfortable and then we read the same scripture a second time and imagine how the early church might have heard this story and how God is speaking to us today through these stories. It is an amazing experience. Are you afraid that you might not know how to go about doing it? Don't worry about a thing! Like any element of our faith, it just takes practice. One of our participants (who has been attending since the first time we offered it in May of 2020) said last week: "I remember you did this same story our very first time together, and I don't know if you are reading it from a different Gospel or from a different Bible, but I sure had a different experience this time!" Nope, same Gospel, same Bible. She has practiced and become skilled at connecting with God through the reading of scripture, and you can too! Join us. With the Good Neighbor Experiment this summer, we are charged with going and living out Jesus' new commandment to love our actual, real-life neighbors.

Questions to Ponder:

- If you have gotten to know a neighbor, what helped you do that?
- If you don't know your neighbor (yet), what is keeping you from taking that first step?

Lord Jesus,

Send us Your Spirit so that we might stretch the limits of our love. Help us to love others as you have loved us.

Amen



This summer, we're finding ways to live our Jesus' command to love our neighbors by doing mini-experiments that may help us better love our literal, actual, next door neighbors!

In Lab 1, we are focusing on the key ingredient of joy, making sure that discernment and authenticity ground our work of neighboring. In Lab 2, we will explore the key ingredient of relationship by meeting and engaging our actual, literal neighbors. Using a Block Map (a map of the 8 neighbors closet to you) this Lab is about moving along the journey from *stranger* to *acquaintance* to *relationship* with our neighbors.

Each week, we will be thinking about a different challenge, or miniexperiment. These mini-experiments are only suggestions. You can modify them in a way that works for you, look up other ideas in the Neighboring Lab participant guides, or dream up your own variation on the theme.

The Participant Guides are wonderful! They include scripture, stories, helpful hints, and pep talks. Pick up a copy at church, download a copy at BUMCLinks, or sign up for the online kick off and have a copy emailed right to your inbox.

A Note from the Finance Committee

In last month's Good Word, we touched on electronic giving and the convenience and security it provides. With that ease and security comes cost. We use a third-party company to process all of our electronic transactions and for that service we are charged a fee monthly. The Finance Committee vetted several different service providers when we first began accepting electronic donations, and selected the best, low-priced option. During the budgeting process every year, we build these fees into our annual operating budget, and on Realm we give donors the option to cover the cost of the fees as a part of their donation. A significant percentage of those that elect to give electronically choose to cover the cost of the fees as a part of their donation, which we greatly appreciate.

We believe that the congregation truly values the option to give to the church electronically, as most of our giving now comes to us through debit and credit cards, texts, and electronic checks. Another benefit of the electronic giving option is that the church has greatly reduced the number of paper giving statements and envelopes that it orders annually. The reduced cost for paper giving statements offsets a portion of the servicing fees for electronic giving, and as an added bonus, less paper is better for the environment.

If you would like to give electronically and avoid servicing fees, you can set up a recurring gift through your bank account whereby your banking institution will regularly send a check to the church on whatever schedule you establish. Your bank will send a physical check to the church and the church office will process as if you had submitted a check in a giving envelope, but since it is a physical check there are no servicer fees involved.

Bike Recap

Getting Spokes to Folks

What a great spring season the bike ministry has experienced. Our monthly fix-its have drawn between 10 and 20 volunteer mechanics each month who have put their gifts and skills to work in repairing the large number of bikes that the community continues to donate. Twenty four bikes were donated in just the month of May! We made one trip to the metal recycling yard with bikes that we were unable to fix and that earned us \$30! That trip also kept a whole lot out of the landfill.

The Ministry was asked to set up a table and tell people about what we are up to on both Saturday (Berea UMC's Earth Keepers Conference) and Sunday (Brecksville City Services) of Earth Day weekend. We met so many nice people and made some great connections. One of those connections was with the good people that run the Ohio City Farm on W24th and Bridge Ave.

The Ohio City Farm, one of the largest urban farms in the entire US covering almost six acres. They employ refugee families and work to provide fresh, local and healthy food to Cleveland's underserved residents, boost the local food economy, and educate the community about the importance of a complete food system. The bikes we delivered to them will be used by the refugees that work the farm and their family members.

Another 5 bikes were delivered to St. Herman's House whose mission it is to shelter and support sober, unhoused men on their path to well being. They work with their residents to help them become independent. It is an amazing organization that does so much good in their community.

We continue to bring bikes to Pearl Road United Methodist church, who distributes them to the people in need in their Old Brooklyn neighborhood. Deliveries are often made to the Nehemiah Mission in Cleveland who distribute the bikes to their young people who are trying to move quickly and safely through their neighborhoods to have the opportunity to play on sports teams and attend the games and practices without having to walk home at night on their own. There are a few other organizations that take a bike here and another bike there to give to youth and adults who can benefit from this sort of transportation.

Thank you for all the support you have given towards the Bike Ministry, you are truly reaching out into the world and doing amazing things! More ways to "Get Off Your Donkey" in June!
