NOT ALL WHO WANDER ARE LOST

"Not all those who wander are lost." This quote is from JRR Tolkien's epic fantasy series *The Lord of the Rings*. In the story, the statement is used to describe Aragorn, who from the perspective of the world, looks like he's wandering aimlessly in the wilderness. But truthfully, he's strengthening his character and being molded for greatness.

I've had the same experience with wandering, particularly when it comes to my faith.

A few weeks ago, I shared in a sermon about a time when I fell away from the church and from God. I was in college, taking a class on Christianity, and I couldn't make sense of how or why people who followed a loving, grace-filled God would wage wars and crusades in God's name. So, I searched other religions—Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam—to see what I could learn; to see if they were any "better" than Christianity. And you know what I found?

I found that people are people no matter what label they place on themselves; that they do horrible, awful things whether they ascribe to this religion or that religion.

And as I searched those other religions, I found God—the God I knew and loved through Jesus. I found stories that were about other people in other places, stories that have value all on their own, and yet God met me in those stories. I read a story from the Islamic faith and was reminded of Jesus; I learned about Buddha and saw Jesus.

I thought that I was wandering (running) away from the God I knew to find something else in these other religions. But my wandering turned out to be exploration with God—God walking alongside me, loving me and showing me God's goodness.

And it's because of my wandering exploration that I returned to my faith home in Christianity. I have greater respect for people of other faiths, as I learned about what they believe and value, and how they understand God. And I have greater confidence that Christianity—faith in God through Jesus Christ—is the way I can best connect with, and find wholeness through, the Divine.

I thought I was wandering because I was lost and trying to find a home. Turns out, my wandering equipped me to be a better pastor in the post-Christian world.

I pray that as we continue through this season of Lent, you allow your heart to wander. Doing so with confidence that God wanders with you, and you just might find yourself closer to Jesus in the end.

After a four-year delay, the **2020 General Conference** is set to take place April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, NC. The United Methodist Church typically holds its General Conference (the lawmaking body of the church) every four years. The coming session was initially scheduled in May 2020 in Minneapolis, but then the pandemic shut down world travel.

In 2020, General Conference delegates were expected to vote on legislation for a denominational separation after decades of intensifying debate over United Methodist bans on same-sex marriage and noncelibate, gay clergy. Now, 4 years later, a separation of sorts has already taken place. About one quarter of U.S. churches have left the denomination under a disaffiliation policy that was passed by the 2019 special General Conference.

Now, delegates will vote on 1,100 petitions (basically the United Methodist equivalent of bills before legislature) on topics ranging from the denomination's policies related to LGBTQ individuals, the denominational budget, social teachings, ecumenical relations, and international structure.

A number of United Methodists have submitted legislation aimed at putting the U.S. and central conferences on equal footing in church decision-making. At this point, central conferences have the authority to adapt the Book of Discipline to their contexts but the United States does not. One result is that U.S. concerns end up dominating General Conference, and the U.S. dominance has contributed to the debates over LGBTQ policies that dominate the global meeting.

As General Conference grows closer, we will have more information available for those who are interested. You may also visit <u>umnews.org</u> to find the latest information.

- numerous front-yard gardens, which provide the added benefit of opportunities to connect with neighbors to share the food, to perhaps share the work, and to build community.
- ▶ Connect children to nature through a pizza garden. Engage young ones in planning, planting, and watching the growth of tomatoes, peppers, onions, and herbs. At the ripe time, have a homemade pizza party. Offer a blessing and, in doing so, connect children to the Giver of all growth.
- ▶ Plan to observe Earth Hour Saturday, March 23, from 8:30 pm to 9:30 pm local time. Along with millions of other people around the world, switch off every single light in your home and talk with your family about being good stewards of the Earth. Think together about what you individually, as a family, or as a church community can commit to doing for a sustainable future.
- Investigate solar for your home, business, and church. New funding is now available, so now is a good time to look at the possibilities that you can make happen.
- Are you planning to remodel or replace appliances soon? Prioritize selections that contribute to energy efficiency. Upgrade your home to care for your other home: Earth.
- Spring weather means shedding heavy winter clothes. Evaluate your wardrobe for items to donate. Plan to visit local thrift shops both to take your donations and to find treasures that fit your fashion sense, your budget, and your commitment to reuse. Too often a purchase made online gets returned and doesn't go back into stock but ends up in a landfill. You can avoid that, support a local business, and feel good about what you wear.
- ▶ Plan now for Earth Day 2024 on April 22, an opportunity to join with others to raise awareness and spark action. Find a few interested people, locally or online, dream big, get others onboard, and plan a day to remember. The theme this year is *Planet vs. Plastic*. Have some serious fun with that!

In February, Leadership Board discussed how Brecksville United Methodist Church's (BUMC) current Mission, Vision Framework and Goals might address some recent church participation trends. Just as BUMC has experienced, recent nation-wide studies show neither Baby Boomers nor Gen Xers have returned to church in quite the same numbers as before the Pandemic.

But our Millennials and their families have become a growth area for both our church and churches nationally! Have you noticed how many children now come forward on Sunday for the Children's Moment?

Our discussion centered on how to reach out to and involve our longtime Members, Baby Boomers and Gen-Xers, and simultaneously serve and involve all other age groups. We will be mindful of this as we work with Pastor Heidi, our Staff and our Church Family.

The Ministry Teams are forming right now, and you are invited to participate! This is how you and I 'get off our donkeys,' to serve in BUMC's ministries, missions and programs. This is how we intentionally serve and love others, by intentionally loving Jesus.

Our church's finances are a constant focus. Leadership Board approved using \$20,442 in available unrestricted reserves to balance and close out the 2023 Financial Statement, but that cannot continue indefinitely. The 2024 Budget still shows a \$51,000 deficit, and needs more support from all of us. This is how we pay for BUMC's day to day operations, programs and ministries. This is also how we pay our terrific Staff's wages.

The 111 pledges received for 2024 is the lowest number in well over 50 years. Some prior pledgers have passed away or moved away. We ask that you prayerfully reconsider your giving, and please submit a pledge if you have not previously done so, or increase your existing pledge. Together, we can successfully support the ministries of BUMC.

At the same time, we must also focus long-term on maintaining our aging church building. The former Trustees Committee explored several major concerns, including replacement of the parking lot asphalt, roof, boilers, and computer network wiring to support our growing online ministries. Leadership Board is in very preliminary discussion on those needs. More will be shared in coming months as information comes into clearer focus.—Alan Scheufler, Chair


