It takes a lot less time to produce this newsletter than it used to, and electronic giving eliminates a lot of administrative work. We have social media accounts and a website people turn to for info. Did you ever think you would learn to worship online? Changes like these, and changes sure to come, have us constantly asking "how do we make the best use of church resources?"

When Leslie Miller retired as Assistant Office Manager last summer, we were in the middle of the pandemic shut down. We were able to delay filling her position for nearly a year, but when office hours resumed it was clear that one person could not do "all the things" - without working six days a week. But did we really need *two* office managers? No. Staff Parish Relations approved dividing the functions of the Office Manager into two positions—Office Manager and Director of Communication & Connection.

After a four month search, Melissa Hinchman has been selected as our new office manager. A lifelong resident of our community, Melissa brings years of experience in business management to the role. Her warm and friendly manner are sure to make everyone who visits the church office feel welcome! What Does "Safe Space" Look Like in Youth Ministry?

A reflection from Dana

As I looked at planning fall programming, I was struck by how much the world has changed since our young people met in person for youth ministry events in early 2020. With the pandemic, social change, political change, and everything in between, offering a place where youth can show up and find sanctuary is more important now than ever before. But what does "safe space" exactly look like in youth ministry? It looks like growing with God and one another through curiosity and wonder. It looks like making memories and creating genuine communities where students feel supported and loved. It looks like students showing up when they can and feeling comfortable being completely themselves. "Safe space" in youth ministry looks like knowing it's okay to not be okay and authentically exploring whatever stage in life students might be living through. **To me, "safe space" means love no matter what.** It's pretty simple. So how will we create "safe space" in youth ministry fall 2021?

We have lots of familiar and new plans for youth programming starting this fall. We are bringing back an old favorite, our All Youth Dinners. The first Sunday of the month will bring good food and good friends together for this monthly meal. Students in sixth through twelth grade are invited to join us for this event. The first will be held at Pastor Heidi's house on September 12! On other Sunday evenings, we will have Youth Group, a place for students in sixth grade and above to find community and grow with God. While weather permits, we will be meeting on the brick patio in the front lawn of the church for an hour of games, devotionals, and some surprises. You never know what we will be up to during youth group! Finally, I am so excited that we will be introducing a new youth opportunity this year - Ecumenical Youth Group! On the fourth Sunday of each month students from churches of different denominations from all over northeast Ohio will gather together for games, devotional time, and a service project. A special thing about this gathering of youth is that it is intentionally open to all kids - and affirming to LGBTQIA+ students. It will truly be a "safe space" for all! I can't wait to see what we learn from our new friends and for the connections that we will make as we grow together with God.

Special Presentation



Aging and LGBTQ+

"It matters not how long we live, but how." Phillip James Bailey

Aging gracefully is not easy for everyone. It takes faith, strength and health, resiliency, support systems, a caring community in the best of circumstances. My eyes were opened to the difficulties many LGBTQ+ seniors face when I took a course on the topic (Occupationaltherapy.com). I learned about the challenges and issues specific to this community. LBTQ+ seniors are:

- Twice as likely to live alone
- 3-4 times less likely to have children for support, relying on their "families of choice" (friends) who are also aging.
- 5 times less likely to seek healthcare/social services out of fear of mistreatment or discrimination.
- Half as likely to have close family for assistance since there may be a contentious relationship with family, if there is one at all.
- Unaware of aging services in the community that could assist them

Think of someone you know that is 65 or older living at home. Picture them needing to downsize to a senior apartment. They choose personal items, meaningful to them to take to their new home. Sadly , many LGBTQ+ seniors are fearful of a new environment that may not be receptive to or affirming of their life experiences or identities. They most likely grew up in an era of discrimination, violence and prejudice that made them fearful to identify themselves to others as LGBTQ+. They may remember that up until 1973, homosexuality was considered a mental disorder. If they have come out openly during their lifetime, when it comes time to move into a facility of some type, they often will go "back into the closet" out of fear of hostility, poor care, or even abuse from staff. If they were married or had a significant other, family may try to prohibit any visits or involvement in their medical care from their partners. If they choose to remain in their homes, finding affirming, open minded care givers can be difficult.

There is some positive news! There are agencies advocating and supporting this population. (See sidebar.)

In closing, I believe this scripture summarizes where our hearts and hands should be:

"Do not cast me away when I am old; do not forsake me when my strength is gone." - Psalm 71:9.

School Supply Drive Completed

Thank you for the wonderful outpouring of school supplies! As usual you were amazing. With your generous donations and some additional funds from M&O, our church was able to prepare 100 students for school this year with the following supplies: 400 folders, 200 packages of paper, 200 notebooks,100 composition notebooks, 1000 pencils, 600 pens, 100 pencil sharpeners, 100 boxes of crayons, 65 Binders, 100 Name tags for their backpacks, rulers, scissors, glue sticks, erasers, markers.

Next Up—Hygiene Kit Drive

Our challenge – 250 kits to be handed out at the MedWorks Vision Clinic at the Cole Eye Institute in October. MedWorks is a Cleveland area organization providing healthcare to the uninsured and underinsured. (Learn more about them at medworksusa.org.) This October event will be their first in person event since the pandemic shutdown, and we will support it by collecting items for and assembling hygiene kits for participants. You can help by donating items for the kits and by helping to assemble the kits. Here's what we need for the kits:

- Gallon sized re-sealable bags
- Bars of soap (3 or 4 ounce)
- Adult Toothbrushes individual factory packaged
- Bath Washcloth
- Bath Hand Towel

- Shampoo (15—18 ounce)
- Deodorant and/or antiperspirant roll on, stick or pump (2-3 ounce size)
- Toothpaste (4—8 ounce size)
- Disposable razors

These items will be due by Sunday, September 19. To help insure that we will have the correct number of each item, we will have pull-tags available to claim at church and a link to an Amazon shopping list where you can purchase items. Confirmation is back!

We are so excited to be welcoming back our Confirmation program this fall. It is such an exciting and important part of a young person's faith journey. This year, we are introducing a new format for Confirmation, extending it to be a two-year cycle for our seventh and eighth graders. This means that students will begin the process of Confirmation in the fall of their 7th grade year and be confirmed in the spring of their 8th grade year.

What does Confirmation look like for those two years?

Confirmation is an opportunity offered to students in 7th grade and above, to have a personal exploration of what it means to be a Christian, and more specifically, a United Methodist. They are invited to learn about scripture, church history, prayer, spiritual development, theology, mission, and the structural connections of the United Methodist Church. This learning takes place during our Sunday morning education hour, in time spent with their mentors, during worship, on retreat, and in many other avenues throughout the year.

The culmination of the confirmation journey ends with students deciding to claim their faith as their own and become full members of the United Methodist Church. Confirmation is a continuation of baptismal vows that parents make for their children, where students can now say for themselves, "yes, I want to follow Jesus and I choose to be a United Methodist."

We could not be more thrilled to be creating a safe space for students to grow with God and one another through the process of Confirmation. Our hope at Brecksville United Methodist Church is that Confirmation can be a place for students to ask questions, follow their curiosity, and find a place in the world where they feel they can be themselves. Confirmation "kicks-off" September 12th during our 10 am service where students will receive a special Confirmation bible and be prayed over by the congregation.
