#### **Church Changes and Church Constants**

Did you know that The United Methodist Church is only 55 years old? It was formed in 1968, when two denominations merged together.



Of course, the Church that the disciples of Jesus formed is thousands of years old, so our roots are deep. However, our branch of the "family tree" was created a little over half a century ago.

55 years is at the same time not that long, *and* a lifetime! Think about the ways our culture and lives have changed since then. In 1968:

Music was predominantly listened to on the radio and vinyl.

Personal computers didn't exist... nor social media, cell phones, GPS, or VHS tapes!

The Church was the center of community life—where people gathered, learned, socialized, and worshiped. And the primary responsibility of the Church was to receive the continuous flow of people coming in the door from a church-centric culture and make them official members.

Now, well, unchurched people are as likely to walk into a church building as they would a wedding they weren't invited to.

We saw these changes happening before 2020, but the pandemic escalated these changes (and more), so they are *very* apparent now: people are spread thin and unable to commit to the church organization like they used to; people are engaging with the church differently—worshiping online as well as in-person; people are choosing small group studies over weekly worship; people are engaging with several different churches to receive teachings from several pastors and communities.

The world has changed. And there's a need for innovation and creativity in the Church like never before. And now, more than ever, we need to be deeply rooted in who God has called us to be and where God is leading us.

However, the church is still structured the same as it was in 1968. It's unable to support the challenges, nuance, and complexity of being the church in 2023 and beyond.

Over the past year, a group of 10 of Brecksville UMC's leaders have been meeting to learn about the "Simplified Accountable Structure." It is a newer way to structure United Methodist Churches that anchors us securely in our God-given vision framework and enables us to address the challenges of the church's future, while staying in-line with United Methodist polity (*The Book of Discipline*).

After many discussions and lots of prayer, this group of leaders has voted to move forward with presenting this new leadership model to our church members as a way to structure Brecksville United Methodist Church for ministry in 2023 and beyond.

I'm reminded of Jesus' analogy in the Gospel of Mark: "And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and the wine is lost as well as the skins. No, new wine is put into fresh wineskins."

As always, I'm excited to be in ministry with you... in incredible ways we haven't even imagined yet!

All are welcome. There is no homework. Drop in anytime!



#### This Light of Ours

An Exhibit at the Maltz Museum

In the 1960's ordinary people risked everything to achieve equality in the segregated south. The Maltz Museum (in Beachwood) is helping tell this story with an exhibit of activist photography of the Civil Rights Movement. The exhibit runs through April 2.

A self-guided audio tour, with prompts for both adults and children, helps bring the 150 black and white photographs to life. Travel with nine activist photographers through the deep south of the 1960s.

Brenda Calovini and I got off our donkey and toured the exhibit one afternoon and were moved by the bravery of the student organizers, photographers and ordinary people who risked everything to enact change; and by the deep faith that help sustain many of them through the fight.


