The Membership Journey

Everyone is welcome (and encouraged!) to participate in the life of Brecksville United Methodist Church, growing in their love of God and serving others through BUMC. Members and first-time guests alike are welcome to participate in just about every aspect of our church community. When people first begin attending church, the questions they usually ask themselves are, "What can I get out of this church?" or "How can this church serve me or help me?" These questions are important as one discerns whether a church is a good "fit" as a place they can grow and serve. But as we become more involved and grow as disciples, the questions change to "What can I do for God through this church?" and "How can I help this church reach more people with the Good News of Jesus?" When this transition happens, it's time to prayerfully consider whether you're ready to become a member of the church.

BUMC's Membership Journey has several steps to help you discern whether we are a good "fit" for you and whether becoming a member is the next step in your faith journey.

Talk with the Team is an opportunity to gather around the table with our Ministry Team, ask questions, and get to know us. We will share about the ministries and missions of BUMC, and take a tour of the building. The next Talk with the Team is on Sunday, October 17 at 11 am.

Basic Beliefs is a 4-week class focused on learning the basics of faith through a United Methodist lens and the history of our denomination. Before you become a member of a United Methodist Church, it's important to know whether you're "our kind of crazy." There's so many wonderful things in The UMC, and you'll hear about them in this class! The next session of Basic Beliefs begins in January 2022, on Sundays at 11 am.

The Membership Class is the final step in the Membership Journey and focuses on what it means to be a discipling, active member of Brecksville UMC: using your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness to love God and love others. In this 3-week class, you will discover your "Jesus story," learn about your God-given gifts and talents, and how you can use those gifts to glorify God through BUMC. Begins March 2022, Sundays at 11 am.

You may take as long or as short as you would like to make your way through this Membership Journey. *Talk with the Team* and *Basic Beliefs* can be taken in any order, but we ask that the *Membership Class* be the last class in your journey. Upon completion, you will decide if you would like to become a member of BUMC and affirm that during worship.

Becoming a discipling, active church member is an important step in being a disciple of Jesus Christ. If you feel led to begin this part of your journey with our church, contact Pastor Heidi to start the conversation! We will offer the Membership Journey each year, as the need arises. 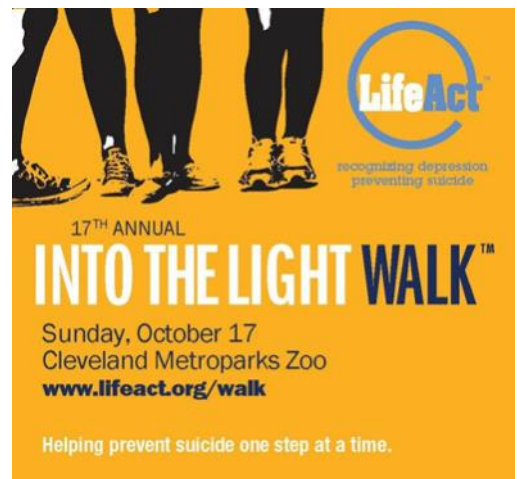

Evening Circle

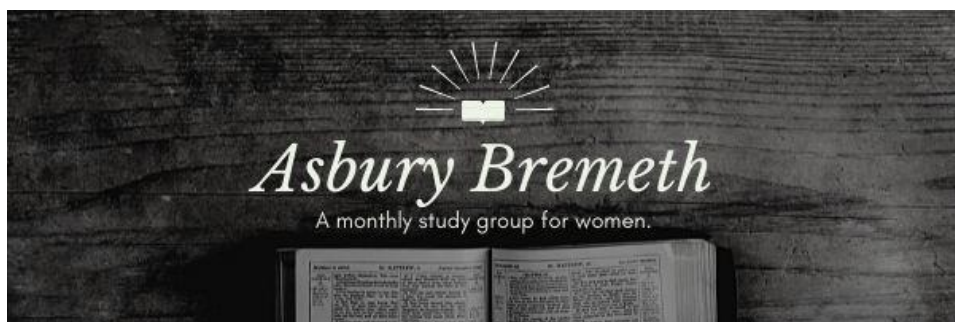
Fun, Friendship and Service

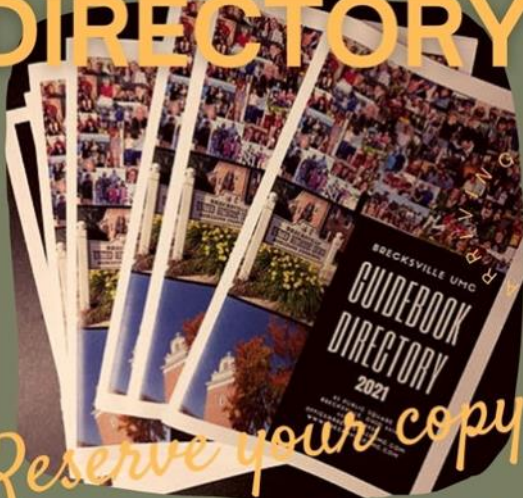

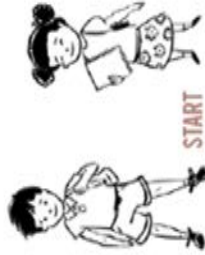
GIVING CHART

To calculate your weekly gift, find your income on the left, and read across to the percentage of income you feel called to give.

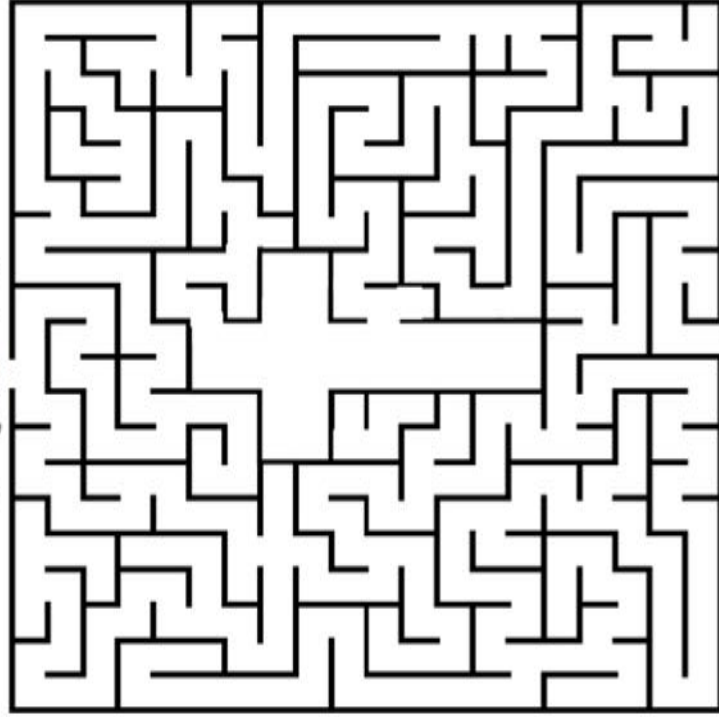

10 Books for World Communion Sunday Expand your understanding about the practice of Holy Communion and our ecumenical global relationships. In preparation for World Communion Sunday, here are some suggested books to read on your own or as part of a small group.

THIS HOLY MYSTERY: A UNITED METHODIST UNDERSTANDING OF HOLY COMMUNION *By Gayle Carlton Felton* - a study guide for the official United Methodist position on Holy Communion adopted by the 2004 General Conference. Available in paperback, Kindle and a PDF download.

OUT OF EVERY TRIBE AND NATION: CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY AT THE ETHNIC ROUNDTABLE *by Justo L. González* The author draws from a diversity of ethnic minority perspectives, developing a more complete understanding to traditional doctrines: creation, salvation, the Word, and the church in its relation to the world.

GLOBAL ARTS AND CHRISTIAN WITNESS: EXEGETING CULTURE, TRANSLATING THE MESSAGE, AND COMMUNICATING CHRIST *By Roberta R. King* Veteran missionary-scholar Roberta King draws on a lifetime of study and firsthand mission experience to show how witness through contextualized global arts can dynamically reveal Christ to all peoples.

FIVE MEANS OF GRACE: EXPERIENCING GOD'S LOVE THE WESLEYAN WAY *By Elaine A. Heath* Based on The Wesley Covenant for Renewal, "Five Means of Grace" will show you how to reorder your life through prayer, searching Scripture, receiving the Lord's Supper, fasting and worshipping together.

MANY FACES, ONE CHURCH: A MANUAL FOR CROSS-RACIAL AND CROSS-CULTURAL MINISTRY *by Glory Dharmanraj, Jacob Dharmanraj, and Ernest S. Lyght* This book outlines what the authors believe church leadership needs to understand in order to fulfill a theological mandate of inclusivity.

VULNERABLE COMMUNION *By Thomas E. Reynolds* As parents of a son with disabilities, Thomas E. Reynolds and his wife know what it's like to be misunderstood by a church community. In "Vulnerable Communion," he draws upon that personal experience and a diverse body of literature to empower churches and individuals to foster deeper hospitality toward persons with disabilities.

ROADMAP TO RECONCILIATION: MOVING COMMUNITIES INTO UNITY, WHOLENESS AND JUSTICE *by Brenda Salter McNeil* We can see the injustice and inequality in our lives and in the world. We are ready to rise up. But how, exactly, do we do this? How does one reconcile?

THE MEANING OF HOLY COMMUNION IN THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH *By E. Byron Anderson* In this resource for newcomers and lifelong members of the church, E. Byron Anderson provides readers with a brief introduction to the meanings and practices of Holy Communion in The United Methodist Church.

CREED: WHAT CHRISTIANS BELIEVE AND WHY *By Adam Hamilton*. Powerful answers to many of our complicated questions are contained in the Apostles' Creed, an early statement of foundational Christian beliefs. This book explores not only what Christians believe, but also why they believe, and why it matters.

JESUS THROUGH MIDDLE EASTERN EYES: CULTURAL STUDIES IN THE GOSPELS *by Kenneth E. Bailey* With a sure but gentle hand, Bailey lifts away the obscuring layers of modern Western interpretation to reveal Jesus in the light of his actual historical and cultural setting.
