Machala leads everyone in music, teaching us all the motions to songs that will be stuck in our head all year.

Crew Leaders guide groups of kids from station to station—science, games, story, and craft—learning about the day's scripture in different ways; pausing for a snack to refuel everyone's hungry bellies.

Before the kids go home each day, we count up the coins and dollars they've brought in for this year's mission: to purchase a goat, pig, and sheep for a family through Heifer International. It's all just... wonderful.

But my favorite part is witnessing all the little moments sprinkled throughout the week. Because my job is "support person," I get to stand back and watch our volunteers live out God's love in all kinds of small, yet beautiful ways...

Cathy sitting "crisscross applesauce" on a blanket, intently looking at whatever little treasure a preschooler excitedly shows her. Jim hugging and whispering words of encouragement to a young boy who did not want his mom to leave. 12 elementary-age kids attentively listening to Julie's every word as she reenacts the day's Bible story. Michelle teaching the kids how to get just the right amount of paint on their paintbrush so their birdhouses turn out as beautiful as can be. Heidi (not me!) telling her group (the Giant Octopi) octopus jokes she Googled the night before. Marla hopping and skipping with her group from one station to the next, in an attempt to keep them from running ahead or lagging behind. These are just a few of the countless precious moments I've witnessed throughout the past few days.

Each small, yet meaningful interaction is an instance where the volunteer uses their natural, God-given gifts to show the kids that they matter—to them and to God. Each moment communicates God's unconditional love in ways the kids can understand, so that it can be carried with the child throughout the rest of their life.

And these moments of care and connection are what make Brecksville United Methodist Church.

The calls and cards to people who are unwell. The hugs of greeting after a long time apart (even if it's only been a week!). The meal train quickly put together for someone in need of a little extra support. A hand on someone's shoulder, reminding them they're not alone in whatever it is they're going through.

Without these moments, we would just be a bunch of people that gather in the same place once a week. But with these moments, we are transformed into the Body of Christ.

This newsletter, for August and September, is filled with opportunities for connection—birthdays and anniversaries, save-the-dates and reminders. At the end of August (when you would normally get the September newsletter) you'll receive a Fall Program Guide, which will include all the ways we are growing and serving together this fall.

Our prayer is that by sharing the opportunities for connection and growth in this way, we can help you intentionally choose the ways you'll engage with Brecksville UMC and its beautiful people in the months to come.

I'm so grateful to be loving and serving alongside you!

Update from the Board of Trustees

Trustees have been busy working on a number of projects at the Church, on the grounds and at the parsonage. You may have noticed the cement work recently completed, this is in advance of new back doors. The West door by the elevator will have a new fully ADA compliant door. Gifts and Memorials and a small grant helped fund this project. These new doors will be installed in mid-August. By early September we should have the automatic door opener operational. Our building was built in 1954 and the Sanctuary and Fellowship hall added about 1964. That is 69 and 59 years ago. This building has served the Church and community well in those years, and we know it will well into the future. With age some things can need attention, like the roof and parking lot. We are considering what to do with these major projects and you will hear more about this in the future. Smaller projects keep us busy as we work to be good stewards of this wonderful building, using our budget and planned expense funds. Take a look around! Eve Circle Donation Drive for Mothers and Babies

About the time that Marissa, then a training coordinator with a national restaurant chain, learned she was pregnant, she also learned her insurance had been canceled. When her application for Medicaid was denied she did not know where to turn. A co-worker recommended she reach out to Womankind, a 50 year old pregnancy and maternal care clinic in Warrensville Heights whose mission is to provide hope, help and possibility to any pregnant woman, regardless of her circumstances.

"Knowing that Womankind could provide my prenatal care and assist with Medicaid was a huge stress relief. It was such a big help," she said. As her pregnancy progressed, Marissa came to enjoy her visits to Womankind's Monday evening clinics, where she did not feel like a charity case. Chemarra Bryant, Womankind's Director of Counseling and Support Services, helped her cope with the stress of not having insurance and worked with her to get Medicaid approval.

"The outpouring of love from everyone at Womankind made me feel comfortable so I could simply focus on having a healthy baby." she said. Baby girl Everly entered this world weighing 5 pounds and 6 ounces, beautiful and healthy. Marissa says she makes sure she tells everyone she knows about Womankind. She exclaimed, "They were the best thing I never knew about. Without Womankind, I probably would have lost my sanity. They were a lifesaver!"

Since 1975, Womankind has been providing free prenatal care and a full range of support services to pregnant women and families with medical, financial and emotional needs. After nearly 50 years, Womankind still offers all confidential and compassionate services — with a non-judgmental approach - at no cost to the clients with no eligibility requirements, regardless of their circumstances.



Brecksville United Methodist Church is called to the ministry of reconciliation. We embrace diversity as a gift. We celebrate our human family's diversity of sexual orientation, gender identity, race, ethnicity, age, faith history, economic status, marital status, physical and mental ability, and education. We affirm that all people are created in the image of God and as beloved children of God, all are worthy of God's love and grace. We welcome the full inclusion of all people in the life and ministries of Brecksville United Methodist Church as we journey toward reconciliation through Christ.

Resolution of the Brecksville United Methodist Church to Change the Congregational Organizational Plan to a Simplified Accountable Governance Structure

WHEREAS, ¶247.2 of the 2016 Book of Discipline for the United Methodist Church allows alternative models of governance; and

WHEREAS, the simplified, accountable leadership structure ("SAS") is utilized as an alternative model throughout the denomination and fulfills the provisions of ¶243 of the 2016 Book of Discipline for the United Methodist Church; and

WHEREAS, the Church Council of Brecksville United Methodist Church ("BUMC") prayerfully voted on April 11, 2023 to explore the simplified, accountable structure for local church governance; and

WHEREAS, the congregation received information regarding the SAS model in various written communications (Blast, Good Word); and

WHEREAS, as part of the discernment process, the congregation had the opportunity to provide, and did provide, feedback concerning a potential change in governance structure via various venues, both in person and via Zoom meetings, including two town halls, church committee meetings, Sunday coffee hour, and small groups; and

WHEREAS, the Church Council unanimously voted on July 11, 2023, to proceed to formally present to the District Superintendent a proposal to convert to the SAS model for reasons of streamlined governance, efficiency in carrying out BUMC's mission and vision, greater accountability, and to increase the opportunities for members of the congregation to utilize their talents, passions and time in carrying out the church's mission; and

WHEREAS, the Church Council, Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development, the SAS discernment task force, and the pastor, after months of discernment, have crafted an alternative organizational model of governance (the "SAS Plan") for BUMC and offered this proposal to the district superintendent for approval; and

WHEREAS, the district superintendent approved the SAS Plan on July 20, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

On January 1, 2024, the disciplinary authority and various responsibilities of the Church Council, Staff Parish Relations Committee, Finance Committee, and Board of Trustees will be combined into a single body called the Leadership Board. Existing elected leadership of all classes of all constituent committees that make up the new Leadership Board will conclude their terms of service on December 31, 2023, as the church transitions to the new SAS Plan.

The Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development of BUMC is directed to submit a list of officers and members of a simplified, accountable leadership structure known as the Leadership Board divided into appropriate three-year classes, as outlined in the Discipline, for election by the Charge Conference. All members of the Leadership Board and the Charge Conference will be professing members. The Chair of the Leadership Board will be elected from among the voting members of the Leadership Board in the first board meeting of each year, and the person so elected will be the Leadership Board Chair. The Leadership Board will be deemed to be the "Board of Trustees" or

"Trustees" on all matters as required by the Discipline, and for those purposes, the Leadership Board Chair will be deemed the Board of Trustees Chair.

On January 1, 2024, the Charge Conference of BUMC will be composed of the members of the Leadership Board, appointed clergy (ex-officio), together with retired ordained ministers and retired diaconal ministers who elect to hold their membership on our Charge Conference, Lay members of Annual Conference, the Lay Leader, Treasurer and Finance Secretary (if non-staff), and the elected membership of the Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development.

The Lay Member of Annual Conference and Lay Leader are ex officio members of the Leadership Board, if not already elected into a membership class of the Leadership Board.

All Disciplinary requirements and qualifications for each of the constituent committees Church Council, Staff Parish Relations Committee, Finance Committee, and Board of Trustees will continue with the combined Leadership Board, including Trustee age of majority qualifications and Staff Parish Relations Committee household membership limitations.

All references to the Church Council, Staff Parish Relations Committee, Finance Committee, and Board of Trustees in all existing church policies, as of December 31, 2023, shall be understood to refer to the Leadership Board beginning on January 1, 2024.

The Board of Trustees is directed immediately to make appropriate amendments, as needed, to the congregation's Articles of Incorporation to reflect the new SAS Plan and submit an update to the Secretary of State's office in a manner defined by state law for nonprofit corporations.

In service to our common mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, all other existing committees and ministry teams will be accountable to the Pastor and Leadership Board in administrative matters and in fulfillment of ¶243. The Gifts and Memorials Committee will be continue to be appointed by the Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development and will be accountable to the Leadership Board in all matters, and is responsible for regular reporting to the Leadership Board.

The Leadership Board will abide with existing financial, child protection, building use, and personnel policies along with the inaugural Guiding Principles. The board will create a Leadership Board Covenant. The Leadership Board is empowered to amend these policies, principles, and covenants. The Leadership Board shall share updated Guiding Principles with the Charge Conference annually.
