VBS Was a Virtual Success

THE DAYS BETWEEN SUNDAYS

For months now, I've been talking about this "holy disturbance": how God is doing a new thing in the midst of upheaval. Because our God is in the business of transformation, making things new, and rebirth, we are not called to stay the same, but grow with God. However, I have failed to acknowledge an important part of the transformation process: recognizing that we need to let go of the "old," because it was harmful to us or does not serve us anymore—we've outgrown it.

As a general rule, as humans, we don't like to recognize that the "old" isn't serving us anymore, because the assumption is that that means we were "wrong" or "not good enough." On the contrary, whatever is being left behind or made new was good and helpful at

one time, but now, as we continue to grow as disciples and in our understanding of God, we must shed what doesn't "fit" anymore so we can continue to grow. The cocoon is integral to the growth and transformation of a caterpillar into a butterfly, but at some point, it must break free in order to become what God has created it to be.

It's no secret that the Church (not just Brecksville UMC, but the greater "Church") is changing. And really, it's been changing for years and decades. It's been increasingly difficult to get people to attend worship services on Sunday mornings: travel sports, weekends away, the death of cultural Christianity, and increased mobility means worship attendance has flat-

lined or decreased. Yet, we (the Church) have insisted that Sunday mornings are the most important, and in order to be a part of the church, you must come to the church building on Sundays.

But COVID-19 forced us out of that cocoon.

We have recognized that we can worship from anywhere. AND that the most important thing about being the church doesn't happen on Sunday mornings, but in the days between Sundays. We've seen that we can reach people who do not live in the same geographical area as we do, and that they can become an active part of our church community through online bible studies and worship.

Yes, we will still have Sunday morning gatherings. Yes, we will still use our beautiful, prime downtown location. But what exactly those things look like, only God knows. And we will continue to investigate ways we can connect with people in new ways, on Sundays and every day in between.

Because the community that is Brecksville UMC is pretty super awesome. And our God is beyond amazing! And it would be plain selfish to keep those things to ourselves. So let us break free of our cocoon and soar with God!

We don't yet know what school will look like in the new year, but we do know that there are kids in need of back packs. Whether school is in the classroom or the living room - we want to equip students for learning. With your help, we can! Our Missions and Outreach Committee is working with two agencies to fill this need.

- The first agency is *The Emergency Assistance Center* for the Nordonia Hills and Twinsburg communities. We have committed to providing them 50 backpacks for teenage girls and 20 for teenage boys. The backpacks must be new, styled for older youth and be able to last the school year so think sturdy.
- The second agency will be the Corner 65 Project of Nehemiah Missions. Our challenge there will be 150 backpacks and school supplies. A detailed list of what type of backpacks age appropriate for each child, etc. will be available soon (in next week's Thursday e-news, on our website, and our social media platforms.) We will be providing the details as we receive them.

The recorded beginnings of Brecksville Methodist women's groups in our church dates back to 1938. Here is some of the history excerpted from *The Church by Chippewa Creek, A History of the Methodist People of Brecksville 1834-1998* by William F. Long.

"The Brecksville Methodist Ladies' Aid Society dates back to 1897, but its activities were only documented in detail starting in 1938. (The oldest record of the Brecksville Methodist Ladies Aid is a picture of 12 members taken about 1897 in front of the home where they were meeting.) The society had modest beginnings; the treasurer's report for 1938 showed a balance of \$33.97, which included money from the sale of fancy work, quilting, white elephants and an Imaginary Bake Sale.


Besides those activities, the Ladies' Aid Society organized a banquet for the Boy Scouts, held a bazaar in November, 1938 to sell baked goods and crafts to raise money to buy two new kerosene stoves for the church kitchen. (There was a Boy Scout Banquet that April. The Sub Debs, seven high school girls, served the meal. They were members of Dolly Beckwith's Sunday School class which met in the back pew of the church. The girls were warned by their mothers, "You serve from the right and take off from the left, don't be lollygaging with the boys, and for heaven's sake wipe off the orange Tangee lipstick.")

In addition, the members of the society all agreed to give gifts to the kitchen that Christmas to furnish it with additional supplies, and they also found the time and money to buy a gallon of Glocoat to wax the church pews. Although their activities might seem incidental, the sense of community this group fostered was very important to the growth of the church.— *Submitted by Sharon Judson, UMW*





What does it mean to be a Reconciling Congregation?

You may have seen the rainbow colored flame that signifies Brecksville United Methodist Church (UMC) is a Reconciling Congregation, but do you know what it means to be a Reconciling Congregation? A little historical context will help you to understand!

At the General Conference held in May 1984 this language was put into the The Book of Discipline (which outlines the law, doctrine, administration, organizational work and procedures of The United Methodist Church):

"homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching" and "no self-avowed practicing homosexual shall be ordained or appointed in the UMC." Each General conference since then has debated the language regarding people in same gender relationships.

At about the same time, the Reconciling Ministries Network (RMN) was born and has adopted this mission statement: 'Living into our shared baptismal covenant, Reconciling Ministries Network equips and mobilizes United Methodists to resist evil, injustice, and oppression as we seek justice for people of all sexual orientations and gender identities."

RMN helps UMC congregations go through a discerning process culminating in a vote to become a Reconciling Congregation. There are currently 1,327 reconciling congregations and 43,060 individuals who are part of the reconciling community in the UMC.

In 2013 Pastor Clark Stein and Joy Fenton-Jones (aka Joy Parker) provided leadership and Brecksville UMC determined that we desired to become a Reconciling Congregation. We went through a period of intense education and study and then voted. On May 11, 2014 86% of the congregation voted to become a Reconciling Congregation. We adopted a Welcoming Statement and we added the rainbow flame to our sign.

Where are we now? Pastor Heidi greets and welcomes all people every Sunday regardless of sexual orientation. Under Pastor Heidi's leadership, Brecksville UMC has created the Inclusion Task Force to help us to figure out how we step into our identity as a reconciling congregation. It is our desire to be a welcoming, affirming and inclusive congregation. We want to intentionally make space at our Brecksville UMC table for people who are LGBTQ and allies. We

General Conference (the body of The UMC with the ability to make changes to The Book of Discipline) was scheduled for May 2020, however due to COVID-19, it has been postponed until August 2021. Plans have been put forth for voting at General Conference that address The UMC's stance on LGBTQ inclusion. This delay has continued the harm done to our LGBTQ siblings and their allies. However, we at BUMC want to spread the word that we already are

creating and will continue to create a safe space for everyone. We believe that all people are created in the image of God and as beloved children of God, all are worthy of God's love and grace.

In the coming months, the Inclusion Task Force will provide ways for individuals in our congregation to actively welcome and affirm our LGBTQ siblings. Please join us!

Making sense of "attendance" when the ushers can't count

I've been thinking about this quote from the sci-fi novel, The Salmon of Doubt, by Douglas Adams. "1. Anything that is in the world when you're born is normal and ordinary and is just a natural part of the way the world works. 2. thirty-five is new and exciting and revolutionary and you can probably get a career in it. 3. Anything invented after you've been feeling like online worship is "against the natural order of things" you're not alone. Some days, it even seems strange to me, and I'm spending most of my waking hours thinking about it (and some of my sleeping hours, too!) But we've got some really good news about this new fangled thing.

Many of us have become much more consistent in our worship habits. We took a snapshot of recorded attendance (that's the people who sign the attendance register or who "like" or "comment" while they're watching on Facebook or YouTube.) Over the last four weeks 70 people have 100% attendance. Perfect attendance! Last summer? Only 32 people did that. It's wonderful that we're choosing to make worship part of our life every week. Even when we travel, we're worshiping from our boats or the beach or our cabins.

We're reaching people at different times of the day and of the week. We know that 16% of the people who

Our streaming report tells us about people who are tuning in to worship services through our website, including where people are watching and the number of views from each region.

watch worship services on our website are watching at a time other than Sunday morning at 9 am. And our YouTube viewers skew even more heavily to other times.

People are utilizing different ways to worship.

91,700 minutes of video have been viewed on our Facebook page since the beginning of April. 923 people saw last Sunday's service, and 84 of them were watching together at the same time on Facebook. We have reached 547 unique viewers on our website since we started streaming services. Our Sermon By Phone and our Podcast listeners are joining in every week as well.

We're not confined by geography. People all over the country and in different parts of the world are joining us. (Our top podcast listener lives in Dublin, Ireland!) Our mothers, fathers, grandparents, sisters and brothers are able to worship "with" us, even though we are apart. Five people who started worshipping with us online are now attending Bible Studies with us, too!

Best of all, we are receiving messages like this: "I started watching your Sunday service when the pandemic caused churches to move to on line services... You all bring joy to my life, and you have done so much to bless the lives of my dear family. I loved Malik in his pride shirt this morning, Jenny is wonderful every Sunday, and I also try to find her on Friday. The praise guys do a

> great job, and I love the Sunday message......always on point, and thought provoking. Thank you for everything you do!!"

It's difficult to get a concise count of true "attendance" numbers. Just know that if you're joining us online, even though you can't see the family sitting next to you, they're there. When this pandemic ends and we're able to gather in the sanctuary again, we'll still be able to share that wonderful experience with people all over the world. God is good!
