I love boxes. They're great ways to contain items that you'll need later—lunch, summer clothes, and Christmas decorations, to name a few. However, I've learned over the years that one thing that can't be put into a box is God.

We try to put God in all kinds of boxes—limiting what God looks like or does. We even tend to do this with our prayers—praying for God to do specific things: healing a friend's cancer or giving us an opportunity we really want. While these prayers are important and good, it's also important to open ourselves to another way of praying: breakthrough prayer.

Breakthrough prayers begin with the understanding that God cannot be contained—God is beyond anything our minds can fathom! Breakthrough prayers invite the Holy Spirit to unleash more than we could ever ask, think, or imagine in our lives, the church, and the world.

On October 29, we began a worship series called Dynamite Prayer, in which we are learning how to open ourselves to God's divine, dynamite power. Yes, we already started the worship series. Yes, the Sunday School is well underway. However: it's never too late to pick up a book either at the church or online and start praying!

As we look to 2024, where is God leading us? How is God calling us to be grace in action? How can we create safe spaces to grow with God and one another? How does God want us to be courageously inclusive? Where is God already working in our community? What incredible things is God leading YOU to do that you haven't even imagined yet?

In January 2024, we begin our new governance structure with our Leadership Board. While they are tasked with setting the vision and goals for BUMC, they don't do that in a vacuum—input and feedback from our whole community is vital in living out God's vision for us!

So, on November 29th at 5:30, we'll gather for a "Dynamite Prayer Potluck." Bring a dish to share (homemade or purchased!) as well as the dreams and ideas God has shared with you. Then, at 7:00, we'll have our final Church Council meeting and pray for the ways God is continuing to lead Brecksville United Methodist Church into 2024 and beyond.


If you have any boxes, you can break them down and put them in the recycling here at church. Because nothing can contain the power of God or the possibilities of this faith community!

Global Ministries EarthKeeper Training

I think about our church parking lot a lot. It's right outside my office window. On hot summer days, I can smell the asphalt. On rainy days, I can hear the water rushing off it. On winter days, I watch the truck dump loads of salt all over it. Right now, the trees that skirt it are ablaze and beautiful. Soon, they'll drop

their leaves and I'll be able to see Chippewa Creek from my desk chair. I see folks coming and going all week—preschool families, Dawnbreakers, recovery groups, the mail truck, folks at Chippewa Place. Our parking lot is busy. Our parking lot is necessary. And because of its size and impermeability, our parking lot is contributing to storm water run off and pollution. That's been nagging at me!

I had done some quick research, but found no easy answers. Then, I learned about Global Ministries EarthKeepers, a program to train and support United Methodist laity and clergy to address local environmental concerns and the systemic structures that give rise to those concerns. I applied and was accepted to represent the East Ohio Conference at the training in Hartford, Connecticut in October.

It was so awesome! We discussed eco-theology and United Methodist entry points into environmental stewardship, identified community assets and concerns, and developed project plans. The training was led by staff from Global Ministries. Our teachers in Connecticut were pastors who had completed EarthKeepers training. The UMC of Hartford, our host church, is home to a successful EarthKeepers project—a beautiful community garden. Projects my diverse group of EarthKeepers are working on include food insecurity & accessibility, environmental education, community nature trails on church grounds, wilderness retreats for urban church women, solar technology for churches, making clothing ministries in NYC more efficient, and developing a network for churches worshiping "in the wild." Our church is now part of a network of resources!

We worshipped, sang and prayed every day and were asked to articulate our call to environmental ministry. I was stepping out of my comfort zone, but I came away from the experience energized and inspired by the many ways United Methodists are responding to our climate crisis and with a deeper understanding of what the Bible says about our responsibility to care for God's amazing creation.




getting the costumes together. We will have a rehearsal on December 20 at 6:30.

Year End Charitable Giving

As we approach the end of 2023, you may be thinking about year end charitable donations.

The IRS allows our friends who are age 70.5 or older to transfer funds *directly* to *Brecksville United Methodist Church* from their IRA. This easy gift, called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), reduces your taxable income. It will also count towards satisfying your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

Contacting your IRA administrator as soon as possible ensures the IRA funds are withdrawn and deposited by December 31, 2023. Otherwise, your gift will not satisfy your 2023 RMD.

The IRS has some good information about charitable distributions on their website (shortcut to the article at BUMCLinks.com). For tax advice, please consult your tax advisor.

If you choose to designate a gift to Brecksville UMC, let us know your QCD is on the way to the office by alerting Jaclyn Torres at Jaclyn@brecksvilleumc.com or by calling 440-526-8938. Please tell us your name, the gift amount, and your IRA administrator. Your generosity will be acknowledged promptly. - The Finance Committee


