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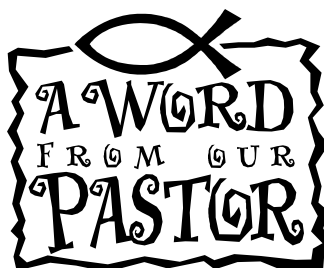

## Doing Discipleship

Comments from Rev. Karen Oehl

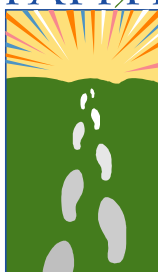
Thank you, Brecksville United Methodist Church. Through your pushing (in the form of the Staff Parish Relations Committee) and financial support (in the form of Gifts and Memorials continuing education funding), I was able to spend the first week of August in Michigan in beautiful Bay View listening to theologian/sociologist/storyteller Tex Sample. I attended a Church Leaders Institute sponsored by the Methodist Theological School in Ohio and Garrett Evangelical Seminary. We heard a lecture in the morning and then in the afternoon members of the Institute had the opportunity to dialogue as a small group with this respected writer.

The theme that Sample built on through the week was the Craft of Discipleship. Discipleship is not a frame of mind or a belief system, it is the activity of one's life. Sample encouraged us to constantly go beyond just thinking about our faith into living it. Too many times we live out our Christianity just in our own minds. Sample called this "sinus theology", which never goes beyond the space above our eyebrows. He focused on four areas in which we can improve the craft of discipleship in our own lives, and more importantly in our shared life as a church.

First, we need to be involved in *Getting the Story Right*. Each person is shaped by the culture, family, and environment that he or she lives in. Every person has a story. But instead of starting with our own story and trying to make God's story fit our values and perspectives, we've got to turn it the other way around. Our task is to allow our own story to be formed by God's story. This takes practice and intention. But it is the way to truly come to know God. Aristotle pointed out that there is a difference between *knowing* and *knowing how*. Being a disciple involves knowing how, and you learn this by doing.

Second, since we need to know God's story to be shaped by it, it is important for us to *Read the Bible as a Church*. The scriptures are the witness of God's ongoing activity in the world, and point us to the craft of discipleship. Within the scriptures we find our key story: the revelation of God in Jesus. The best way to read and interpret scripture is not alone, but as a community of faith. This provides a corrective to our habit of putting our own story first. As a community we are looking to interact with God in the scriptures, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Sample described reading the Bible as a Church this way: "Interpreting scripture is more like performing the script of a play than constructing history from fragments. It is not fiction. Not play acting. It is engaging the life of the entire community; the church."

Third, the craft of discipleship by definition will involve us in *Doing Justice*. Sample cautioned us against reducing justice to an issue of rights, and justification to an issue of forgiveness of sins. Instead, God's justification, enacted by Jesus, puts us into a right relationship with God and others. In this new relationship, this new world created by Jesus, there is no difference between Jew or Gentile, slave or free, man or woman

## There's Something for Everyone at BUMC!

### SUNDAY SCHOOL OPTIONS

**Birth to age 3 - Crib and Toddler Room, 206:** Nursery care is available during both worship services as well as during Sunday School Classes. Toys fill this room and two caregivers will be with the children.

**3 to 5 year olds - Godly Play** is a method of Christian Education and spiritual direction that teaches children the art of using religious language - sacred story, parable, silence and liturgical action - helping them become more fully aware of the mystery of God's presence around them and in their lives.

**3 years through 2nd grade students - Sprouts** is offered during both Worship Services. Parents should sign their children into the Sprouts room before worship begins and proceed to worship with their children. After the Children's Moment your child will be escorted to Room 103 for the remainder of worship service. Your child can be escorted directly to Godly Play or Rotation if you indicate this on the sign in sheet.

**1st Grade through 5th Grade - Rotation** model Sunday School teaches Bible stories and concepts through kid-friendly multimedia workshops. The same Bible story will be taught in each of the workshops during the 5-7 week period. This approach will teach a different aspect of the story each week providing the children a chance to delve deeper and explore God's word.

**Location:** Parent drop off and pick up will be in whatever room the child's grade is rotating to that particular Sunday. Rotation classes are posted in the main church hallway (2<sup>nd</sup> floor) each Sunday.

**6th through 8th Grades - Young Disciples** are more traditional Sunday school classes broken down by grade level intended to grow young disciples of Christ. The students will take a deeper look at the Bible and reflect on how the teachings fit into their life today. The 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> grade combined class will meet in the back half of Room 301. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade class will meet in Room 402.

### “Conflict: Overcoming Stress in Your Relationships”

**11-12 Graders**, do you face conflict on a regular basis? Is life just a string of stress after stress after stress? ### *Twelve Ordinary Men*

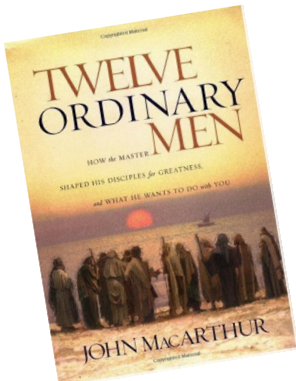
Facilitated by Les and Cathy Buttolph

### *Living in Christ, Serving in Love: Bringing the "Spiritual" and the "Secular" Together*

Our mission statement at BUMC beautifully states our purpose as Christians in the world. But do you ever catch yourself saying something like, "You know, we have done such a good job focusing on service; it is really time to invest ourselves on growing our spiritual lives." Or perhaps you've thought, "What good does it do me to spend all this time in Bible study if I can't find any practical application to my life?!"

From time to time, we all get caught up in *dualistic* thinking, a subject that Robert McAfee Brown addresses with humor and wisdom in his wonderful book, *Spirituality and Liberation: Overcoming the Great Fallacy*. This is a text about setting our philosophy in such a way that it can harmoniously guide every aspect of our daily life... both those areas that seem "spiritual" and those areas that seem "secular." (Except by the end, you may be convinced that they are one and the same!)

This book is not for the faint of heart. If you are ready to be challenged, not only in your thinking but in your ability to read and synthesize challenging content, this class is for you! To aid in your study, Joy is offering this text as a **book on CD**. She will take you, aloud, through the entire content of this text, so that you can listen in conjunction with your reading, while commuting, or while going about your daily activities.

### "What Do I do when my child transitions from one level to another?"

Is your child moving from Godly Play to Rotation, out of Rotation and into Young Disciples, or are you the proud parent of a 9<sup>th</sup> grader entering the senior high program? If so, don't fret... the transition is simple.

For all of our incoming first graders we will hold a meeting after the 8:45 worship service on September 12. Parents and children, please meet Jenny in the parlor to learn how rotation will be different for you compared to Godly Play. You will then be escorted to your classroom.

For students leaving Rotation and entering Young Disciples, meet in your assigned room – 6 and 7<sup>th</sup> graders in Room 301 B and 8<sup>th</sup> graders in Room 402. This will be your classroom for the entire school year. You will meet your teachers and have time to catch up with each other.

9<sup>th</sup> Graders, "you have arrived." Meet in the youth room on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor!

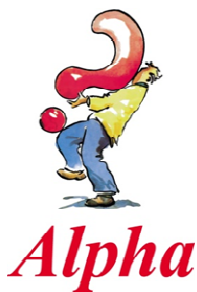

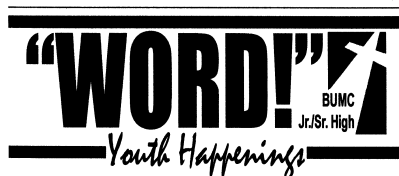
Lois Urban has moved a little closer to the church, and is now residing at Chippewa Place.

(quoting Paul). Doing justice as Christians means living in this new world, *as* this new creation. The new world has not come for everyone yet, but we live as if it had. We are called, as the church, to be an alternative community.

Finally, the craft of discipleship means acting as a *Witness*. The word witness is packed with many meanings that include dimensions both of hearing or seeing and acting. It is actually related to the same root word as martyr. A martyr lives out belief or faith, even unto death. We are not all called to be martyrs, but we are called to be witnesses in some way—to live out God's story. Sample quoted St. Francis for this practice: "Preach the gospel at all times; if necessary, use words."

The craft of discipleship, then, is living in such a way that we are constantly learning, growing, acting, and being formed by God in Jesus and through the power of the Holy Spirit. What is your story? How have you allowed yourself to be shaped by God's story? Or when have you heard the gospel—the good news about Jesus—and just knew that you had to act on it? How is Brecksville UMC reading the Bible, doing justice, and acting as a witness in the world? I look forward to grappling more with these things in community in the coming year. My continuing education is something we all share!
