Volunteer in Mission Team Update

When seven year old Anastasia Brachna learned that members of her church were going to visit an orphanage in Russia, she wanted to help. Her mother explained that the orphanage was in need of things the kids could play with outside, so Anastsia took a look through her own toys and found a big pink ball. She wrote a note, "I love Russia, because I was born there. From Anastasia to Russia."

Our own Bruce McCrodden and Tony Cipolla joined an 18-member team from the East Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church on the Volunteers in Mission trip to Kursk, a city in southern Russia, where they worked at a boarding school serving developmentally delayed youngsters aged 7 to 21.

With them, they took the sports and recreation equipment you donated for the students of the boarding school. Thanks to your generosity, they set off for Russia with a suitcase full of jump ropes, sidewalk chalk, Frisbees, and balls of all sizes, including Anastasia's big pink ball.

After hearing the story of the pink ball, the children wrote a note back. "Anastasia, We really liked the pink playground ball that you sent to us with the volunteer team from your church that is visiting with us at Boarding School Number 5 in Kursk, Russia. The people from your church brought lots of gifts but we liked the pink ball best. We know that you gave us one of your favorite toys. Thank you very much. You will always be special to us. Spasibo Bolshoi!" (That means "Thank you very much!" in Russian!)

Deuteronomy 5:12

On November 1, 1964, at the end of a twelve-year building project, Brecksville United Methodist Church consecrated its current Sanctuary. The following month, after more than a year of research, the Organ Committee proposed the purchase of a new Casavant pipe organ to the Trustees.

Space and budget constraints dictated that the new organ favor a balanced ensemble sound. It omitted specialized voices in the belief that classic specifications would ensure a fresh, clear and contemporary sound for many years. The installation was completed in time for Christmas 1966 at a cost of \$30,000.


Flash forward to 2012. Casavant is still world-renowned for building some of the finest pipe organs in places as far away as China. Visit their website: www.casavant.ca for a tour of the factory and pictures of recent projects. According to the Casavant firm, the replacement cost of our organ is now over \$500,000.

Over the years we have made additions to the organ. In 1974, to complete the initial organ design, we added a Gemshorn stop at a cost of \$6,500. In the 1980's eighteen year old Chris Toth joined the staff. Chris oversaw expansion of the instrument, adding a new Oboe stop and making the existing Trumpet stop available to the organist on both keyboards and pedal. This required an additional investment of \$8,500.

Given its rich history, we are excited to add yet another chapter to the story of our Casavant organ. Chris has identified some meaningful improvements to expand the ease of playing the organ and the quality of its sound.

Church archives include information about the installation of the organ in 1966. A program from the opening organ recital, performed by Dr. Warren L. Berryman in 1966, and a two page hand out about the instrument are both posted on the church website:

The back of the program states "This Two-Manual Organ, designed and built by Cassavant Freres, St. Hyacinthe, Canada, is based on the classical principles of organ building developed during the 17th and 18th centuries. It consists of 21 stops containing 29 ranks of pipes speaking on two inches of wind. Each division of

the organ is complete and independent with the great and pedal exposed on the right and the enclosed swell division on the left. Although partially veiled from view by the chancel screen there is no obstruction to the clear articulate sound of the pipes."

And in a substantive new preface, Elie reflects on the enduring importance of Night and his lifelong, passionate dedication to ensuring that the world never forgets man's capacity for inhumanity to man.

Bad Religion offers a masterful and hard-hitting account of how American Christianity has gone off the rails—and why it threatens to take American society with it. Writing for an era dominated by recession,

gridlock, and fears of American decline, Douthat exposes the spiritual roots of the nation's political and economic crises. He argues that America's problem isn't too much religion, nor is it an intolerant secularism. Rather, it's bad religion: the slowmotion collapse of traditional faith and the rise of a variety of pseudo-Christianities that stroke our egos, indulge our follies, and encourage our worst impulses. Douthat's urgent call for a revival of traditional Christianity is sure to generate controversy, and it will be vital reading for all those concerned about the imperiled American future.

In this summer season of graduation parties, weddings, vacations and family reunions, we pause and praise God for family and friends, and ask for traveling mercies for those on the road.



Church gets kudos in malaria fight

TAMPA, Fla. — Rear Adm. Tim Ziemer, the U.S. government's global malaria coordinator, praised The United Methodist Church as a "critical partner in the fight against malaria." By raising funds and distributing mosquito nets, the denomination has helped save an estimated 200,000 lives a year, Ziemer said in a recent video address to General Conference 2012, the church's top legislative body. "The United Methodist Church has kind of set the high bar, the standard, in how to engage as a faith-based organization, as a denomination providing leadership and vision," Ziemer added.

Survey finds clergy's worries add pounds

GLENVIEW, Ill. — Stress is one of the biggest health risks facing United Methodist clergy, according to a new study released by the United Methodist Board of Pension and Health Benefits. And, too many church potlucks, pizza-delivery nights and meals on the run aren't helping. Based on the responses of some 2,000 pastors, the survey found significantly higher rates of health problems than comparable U.S. adults.

Fire consumes Minneapolis church

MINNEAPOLIS — Five firefighters were injured in a blaze that gutted the historic Walker Community United Methodist Church. The fire began in the attic of the 102-year-old church between 8 p.m. and 9 p.m. May 27. There was a thunderstorm at the time, and fire officials suggested a lightning strike may have caused the fire.

Fire destroys rural Arkansas church

CARLISLE, Ark. — On the afternoon of Wednesday, May 30, members of Hickory Plains United Methodist Church, a rural community church in central Arkansas, watched their church building burn to the ground. "We lost the building, but we didn't lose the church," said the Rev. Debbye Harrison, the pastor.

New B.A. in addiction prevention

OKLAHOMA CITY (UMNS) — Drinking by college students contributes to an estimated 1,825 deaths, 599,000 injuries and 97,000 cases of sexual assault each year in the U.S. The United Methodist-related Oklahoma City University has created a bachelor's degree program in addiction-prevention studies.

Mobile apps for church leaders

NASHVILLE, Tenn.— Following the example set by Ecclesiastes, this is the season of mobile apps for just about everything. You can use your phone to post the church potluck on Facebook, look up this week's biblical texts and instantly sift through 4,000 names in the Bible.
