


Graves Are Empty Places




Interfaith Passover Seder Wednesday, April 5 at 7 pm

OUTREACH GETS A LITTLE CLOSER

Joy Parker examines our church and the community it serves.

Recently, Joy Parker was hired as Director of Outreach at Brecks-ville United Methodist Church. This new position addresses the need for the church to reach past the physical walls of the building and get in touch with the needs of the community and beyond. Joy provided an overview of her vision as the Director of Outreach in the February Good Word. She also mentioned recent progress in areas of Outreach along with an invitation to help. There are many exciting Outreach possibilities our congregation can embrace. I posed some questions to Joy, hoping to clarify what we can do to help "get back to basics" identify areas for Outreach and realize those opportunities for Brecksville United Methodist Church.

"...when someone you love needs you, you try to be there; and when you need them, they do the same. These are the kind of relationships for which I am pray-

ing!"

Q. What are your responsibilities as the Director of Outreach?

As with every position at BUMC, the list of responsibilities is a moving target and many tasks ending up falling under the designation, "other duties as assigned." However, I have developed four pillars that I am using to guide and structure my work.

- **IDENTITY** What defines us as a faith community at BUMC? What are we doing to promote that identity in our community?
- ENGAGEMENT What percentage of our existing church family is actively participating in ministry and mission? How can we raise that percentage?
- MISSIONAL OUTREACH What are we doing to serve the community? Are we meeting the real needs of our brothers and sisters both locally and globally?
- INVITATIONAL OUTREACH —
 What are we doing to grow our community? Are there new opportunities we could offer? Are there ways to improve existing programs and activities so that they better welcome those in our community who do not yet have a church home?
- Q. In your last Good Word article you mention that our church got "back to the basics" and "reflected our core values as United Methodists." Can you elaborate on what the basics are and the core values with which we as a congregation should be aligned?

Yes! Our core mission statement as United Methodists is "To make and mature disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Here at Brecksville UMC, we have refined that down to the following three simple phrases:

- **OPEN DOORS** Everyone is welcome, all the time, no exceptions. But that is a challenging mandate. It's actually really hard to create a truly welcoming environment for all people, and it's also a challenge to let the community know that we welcome them! That's really the 'identity' piece in my four pillars (above).
- HONEST WORSHIP Our worship is—and should be—authentic, culturally relevant, and reflective of the reality of human experience in our time and place. We also have to recognize that worship is not just what happens for an hour on Sunday morning. It's a faithful way of living that pervades every day of the week... the 'engagement' piece of the four pillars.
- **DETERMINED SERVICE** This is the 'outreach' in which we undertake to serve our community—meeting physical, emotional, and spiritual needs in ways that are transformative. It means meeting people where they are, hearing what folks have to say to us, and being brave enough to really enter into relationships, knowing that those relationships will call us to leave our comfort zones and walk some unfamiliar paths.

Q. Can you provide an example of a long -term sustainable partnership?

Sure! This is a theological issue, though, not just a logistical one. As Christians, we believe that God calls us into partnership with others NOT so we can "save them" or solve

problems for them. Rather, we are called into ministry because we are equally in need of salvation. We actually have a spiritual need to consider others before ourselves, to see more of the world as God sees it, to draw close to brothers and sisters who look and live differently than we do.

I think great partnerships will be of every shape and size. At Nehemiah Mission, we are exploring partnerships that might pair a single individual or family from our church with a homebound individual in Cleveland for the sharing of time, love, conversation and presence. Some might be more "institutional" partnerships in which we commit time, presence, and funding over a longer period of time as we do with our Habitat for Humanity Apostles' Build. I would like to see EVERY individual in our congregation involved in some sort of ministry partnership that would be transformative for everyone involved!

Q. How much time should we expect to devote to nurturing a partnership? Is there a monetary component to every partnership?

Hmm... I think my only answer is that we'll have to devote as much time as is needed. I would love to see our attitude toward this be more like the way we approach our closest friends or family members. It is not always possible to predict when or how much they will need us. But when someone you love needs you, you try to be there; and when you need them, they do the same. These are the kind of relationships for which I am praying!

Frankly, I do not think every partnership has a monetary component. Many do, but not all. We are working to build God's kingdom in this world, and that means meeting physical needs, spiritual needs, and emotional/psychological needs. Those can't all be fixed with money!

Q. Church and Society is focusing on three areas: Addiction, LGBT Awareness and Refugee Response & Support. For those not aware of what Brecksville United Methodist church has already done, can you give an example of what our church has already accomplished in each area? How can our congregation help Church and Society with Outreach goals in these three focus areas?

Yes, that's right, although I will just point out that our Outreach Team will have their own areas of focus. I hope there will be some overlap, but Church & Society has the specific task of calling our attention to issues of social justice, while Outreach Committee strives to identify the needs of the community and be present to those needs. The committees are related but not the same.

In response to the addiction crisis, our church has offered an educational series that brought wonderful speakers both to our church building and also to community locations for education and conversation. Several of our church members are also involved with 'Greater than Heroin,' a community action group that meets monthly to share ideas and spur each other on to keep working on this serious problem. We're also working on an upcoming "safe disposal" campaign to help families better handle prescription drugs in the home.

Brecksville UMC is a Reconciling Church, so our LGBT brothers and sisters are welcome here. We continue to explore ways to make sure people KNOW they are welcome and also provide an environment in which visitors know they are welcome by our words, our actions, our physical space, and our hospitality. We are also creating cards to be placed at the LGBT Center in Cleveland to let individuals know that there are welcoming United Methodist Churches in the Cleveland area.

Church & Society is in conversation with the Outreach Coordinator at USCRI Cleveland. That's the US Committee on Refugees and Immigrants, located downtown on Superior Avenue. We are still learning what the needs are in our area and how we could best respond to those needs in ways that build relationship and result in the kind of ongoing partnership that I described above.

- Did you know that unintentional drug overdose continues to be the leading cause of injury-related death in Ohio in 2015, ahead of motor vehicle traffic crashes (a trend which began in 2007)?
- Did you know that MANY instances of heroin addiction start with dependency on prescription medications?
- Did you know that there is a simple way YOU can help?

During the week of April 23-29, we will partner with churches and community organizations around Ohio to bring awareness to this critically important issue.

Most important, we want you to be aware of the ways in which you can help.

We will kick off our campaign with a moment for education in each worship service on Sunday, April 23. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards."

On an unseasonably warm February afternoon, a group of eight eighth graders and several adults from Brecksville United Methodist Church traveled an hour south through the rolling hills of Ohio to Camp Wanake for an overnight retreat.

These kids are in their confirmation year, a time to explore, journey, and embrace their Christian faith as their own. During this year, confirmands are challenged to immerse themselves in their faith and make a commitment to God. It is a challenge that only *they* can take on. It is a time in which they choose, for themselves, that God's ways are greater than the world's ways. A decision which is not an end, but a beginning.

As part of this journey, participants were asked to leave their iPads at home and prepare for an overnight adventure and time outdoors. Camp Wanake is a 330 acre Methodist camp in a beautiful, spiritual place among the hills. Campers went on a trail hike, played gaga ball, and enjoyed delicious meals prepared by camp staff.

Best of all, this group of grace-filled kids grew closer to one another and closer to God. At dinner, one of the confirmands offered a prayer of thanksgiving for friends, food, camp staff and a time away to be with God. Jenny Gee, Director of Christian Education, was moved to tears. "It was so mean-

ingful to hear this young person without walls up, volunteering his prayer without hesitation, and being truly thankful to God for the simple gifts of the day."

On Sunday morning, the kids woke early for a Taizé Worship service at sunrise. Really! As the sun rose over the hills, the confirmands sang and worshiped God. Youth Director, Dana Schwendeman, led the service and said, "Our service reflected on three elements; peace, hope, and love. Students read quotes from influential leaders of history and scripture was also included. It was a true Holy Spirit moment."

A time apart. A time together. A time to travel, to reflect, to share. A time to eat, to experience nature and to have fun. A time to worship. A good time. That was the 2017 Confirmation retreat!
