Read Romans 8:24-30

Peter Abrams was known as a man of serene disposition. Nobody in his town could recall his having lost his temper at any time during his 87 years. One man, who doubted the possibility that a person could be so unflappable, made a deal with the housekeeper, offering her money if she could provoke him to anger.



The housekeeper knew that Abrams was very fond of a comfortable, orderly bed, so she neglected to make his bed one day. The next morning, Abrams kindly reminded her of the undone chore. The next night, Abrams again found an unmade bed and the following morning, he again called it to her attention. She made a lame excuse, which he kindly accepted.

On the third morning, Abrams said, "You still have not made my bed; it is evident you are determined not to do it. Well, I suppose you find the job trouble-some; but it is of little consequence, for I begin to be used to it already." Moved by such goodness of temper, the woman called off the deal and never again failed to make his bed as comfortable as possible!

Not everything can be the way that we like it all of the time, but criticism and harsh words rarely bring about a lasting and peaceful cooperation or fulfillment of our desires. Patience and kindness, on the other hand, often do.

3 Ways We're Improving Ministry at BUMC Together



There is a tremendous energy in the air. Church leaders met recently to discuss the feedback received from the church focus groups Rev. Dave Martin conducted with us in January. Pastor Clark lead a discussion which asked "Where is our church now, and where do we want it to be?" Together, the team identified three main areas of focus for both short and long term goals.

- 1. Grow our community of faith by developing our welcoming ministry. Prior to the meeting, everyone reviewed the book <u>Becoming a</u> <u>Welcoming Church</u> by Thom S. Rainer. This drove a lot of great discussion. While we think of our church as a welcoming place, are we as welcoming as we think we are? Or as we can be? Want a copy of the book? See Jenny!
- 2. Increase passion for our church missions and ministry. We'll find ways to amplify the ministries people are passionate about and to educate the congregation about ways to serve. By instituting a Missions Moment during worship, individuals involved in different projects will have the opportunity to teach others about their experiences.
- 3. **Re-connecting with those who have disconnected from the church.** While we're committed to reaching out into the community,
 we are also committed to taking care of those who are already here.
 When we notice that someone has stepped away, what can we do to
 reconnect with them? How can we continue to grow and develop disciples of Christ for the transformation of the world?

(Cleveland, OH) - April 19. What do you do when the calendar reads "April" but the weather forecast calls for snow? You bundle up and get to work! Especially when the work is with Apostles Build, a program within Habitat for Humanity which pulls together area churches to provide the financing and labor needed to rehabilitate a home for a partner family.

Our team of 8 traveled to West 97th street in Cleveland to lend a hand in preparing the house for Michelle and her two young sons. For them, home means structure and stability. Through Habitat, Michelle has the opportunity to become a homeowner in a neighborhood they're familiar with which is close to the boys' school. Michelle said that owning her own home will help her save, "No more rent increases every year. Soon it will be all mine—having family time and cookouts!"

Habitat's fully-rehabbed homes are sold at no profit with zero percent interest mortgages, with minimal down payments and closing costs. Approved homeowners qualify for a monthly housing payment no more than 30% of their monthly income. Applicants must demonstrate a need for housing and the ability to pay their mortgage, must complete financial literacy classes, and must complete 250 hours of work with Habitat.

Other area churches participating this year include Church of St. Dominic, Church of the Holy Angels, Lord of Life Lutheran Church, Old Stone Church, Plymouth Church UCC - Shaker Heights, St. Joseph Catholic Church - Strongsville, St. Mark Church West Park, Strongsville United Methodist Church, Church of the Covenant, Church Of The Western Reserve, St. Mary of the Falls Church, and Fairmount Presbyterian Church.

With Apostles Build, we're putting our faith into action—going out into the community to serve others in the way that Jesus' apostles served. What a blessing to be able to share God's love by helping to fully rehab a house for Michelle and her boys!



HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHURCH!

It is time to say Happy Birthday church! On Pentecost Sunday, we commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit to the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost, just weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church."

The English word "Pentecost" is from the Greek pentekostos, which means "fifty." It comes from the ancient Christian expression pentekoste hemera, which means "fiftieth day." The early Christians borrowed the phrase from Greek-speaking Jews who used it to refer to an already existing Jewish holiday, the Festival of Weeks, or, more simply, Weeks (Shavuot in Hebrew). This name comes from an expression in Leviticus 23:16, which instructs people to count seven weeks or "fifty days" from the end of Passover to the beginning of the next holiday.

Shavuot was the second great feast in Israel's yearly cycle of holy days. It was originally a harvest festival similar to our Thanksgiving. Over time, it turned into a day to commemorate the giving of the law on Mt. Sinai. This day became especially significant for Christians because seven weeks after the resurrection of Jesus, during the Jewish celebration of Shavuot, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon his first followers, empowering them for their mission and gathering them together as a church.

The events of this day are recorded in the book of Acts. Chapter 2 begins, "And when the day of Pentecost had come, the first followers of Jesus were all together in one place." All of a sudden, a sound came from heaven, like a strong wind, filling the house where the people had gathered. Something like

tongues of fire rested on their heads. "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit gave them the ability to speak".

The languages spoken by the early Christians were intelligible and were heard by thousands of Jewish pilgrims who had come to Jerusalem to celebrate Shavuot. The content of their miraculous messages had to do with God's mighty works. Many who heard these messages in their own languages were amazed. Others thought the Christians were drunk.

At some point, Peter stood up and preached his first sermon. He explained that Jesus had been raised and had poured out the Spirit in fulfillment of God's promise through the prophets. When the crowd asked what they should do, Peter urged them to turn their lives around and be baptized in the name of Jesus. Then they would be forgiven and would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Acts reports that about 3,000 people were added to the church that day!

Join us as we celebrate Pentecost Sunday (May 20) at Brecksville UMC.

The Sanctuary will be filled with red to symbolize the power and fire of the Spirit. Pastor's stole will be red, the paraments (or altar cloths) will be red, and we encourage the congregation to wear red! Beautiful red geraniums celebrating those whose faithful Christian witness has been an inspiration to us will adorn the altar. (Have you ordered yours?) We will also be confirming six young people on this special Pentecost Sunday! It is traditional to receive new members or confirm youth into the church as a way of commemorating the first "new members class" that joined the church after Peter's Pentecost sermon.
