#### TAKE THE NEXT RIGHT STEP

I have a confession to make. I haven't gone running in the past month. I could come up with a million excuses (and I have!) but most of all I've just felt guilty because I told you I was going to run a half marathon and then didn't. Sometimes this happens. We have this huge goal or idea out in front of us and we're excited about it, but don't know where to start or get overwhelmed and so we just don't. And then we feel guilty and the feelings compound and it's just a mess. We're no farther along than we were to begin with.

Being a Christian can feel like this. "If being like Jesus is my goal, I know I can't accomplish that so I'm just not going to try." Or "In the Church it always feels like you want me to do more—like I'm not doing enough. So why even go?"

I get it! I really, really do! But here's the thing:

Yes, the goal is to be like Jesus (and that is a very lofty goal!) but that's not the goal for next month or next year. Being like Jesus is a lifetime goal.

And yes, we do want you to do "more" (worship more, come to small groups, volunteer, give, etc.) but that's because we like you and we want to "see" you! And we want you to grow as a disciple of Jesus!

The big goal of "being like Jesus" can be overwhelming and the expectation of "being a disciple" can seem daunting. But right now, the goal is to take the next right step.

I haven't gone running for a month,

but you know what I have done? I've walked 4 miles at least 3 times the past two weeks. And I've increased my daily steps each day, too! I haven't run my half marathon yet, but I am getting active, and I am taking a step in the right direction.

This is all we ask of you as a part of this church.

In this new time of being the church, our goal as a ministry team is to help bring you into the presence of God: to give you the tools and skills you need to take ownership of your faith and take your next right step towards being like Jesus in your daily lives. For you, this might mean raising your voice in prayer more often or cracking open your bible and digging into God's

Word or joining a small group even though that sounds like the scariest thing in the world.

I just want you to know: you can do this!

You can pray to God! It doesn't have to be fancy or include certain words. It can be a song, or a phrase you say over and over, or "Hey God, this is what I did today." Prayer is opening up yourself to God through conversation—both talking and listening.

You can read scripture! You don't have to have a degree in... anything... to read scripture. You don't even have to have opened the bible before in your life. Like prayer, to read scripture you just have to open yourself up to God's Spirit and be willing to learn.

You can be a disciple! You don't have to have Jesus all figured out to be a disciple. You just have to be willing to try and apply Jesus' teachings of love, compassion... wait. GUYS. All discipleship is, is living out what Jesus taught in the Sermon on the Mount! We just spent 10 weeks learning about that! *You know how to do this!* 

To follow Jesus, you just have to be willing to take the next right step. And we will be right beside you on your journey, because none of us are meant to do this alone. This fall we have some new classes and small groups and practical sermons and ways to connect that will help you apply your faith to your daily life and take your next right step in your journey.

I have confidence in you and faith in God that you can do this!



We have seen the posts and heard a lot of remarks about how crazy 2020 has been. One thing that has been true for me and my family (and I bet for you and yours as well) is that we have learned new ways to do old things. It is easy to get stuck in routines of doing everything the same old way. It's comfortable, and frankly, less scary. But when we are forced to do something new, we wonder why we hadn't tried it earlier.

Over the years at Brecksville UMC we have talked a lot about ways to help families have the tools they need to continue their faith conversations at home. We know that God calls the family to 'do faith' and disciple together. How do we do it and what does it look like?

Family discipleship isn't one-size-fits-all, and it isn't always easy to do alone. Even when you are at your most intentional it is helpful to have others alongside of you. In these times apart, we are committed to helping you and your family continue on your faith walk together.

- *First, worship together!* Our virtual worship is incredibly meaningful, and September brings us some new ways to worship together. Worshipping together is one of the most spiritually significant and influential things your family can do. Online worship is at 9 am on Sundays (and available anytime!) The service is replayed on Thursdays and is available the whole week through. Sundays at 5, there will be a short prayer service in the church parking lot, too.
- Allow your child to connect with others of similar ages on Sunday mornings. Allie Kenney, our nursery care giver, will be checking in with your kids in half hour increments on Zoom. The times are 11 am for our preschool through Kindergarteners, 11:30 am for our 1st through 3rd graders and at 12 noon with our 4th and 5th graders. This will be a time for connection and conversation mostly social but with an aim to support and encourage your child. Contact us for the Zoom link!
- Reserve a Family Faith Bag. On September 7 and 8, Jenny will be stopping by your home with a Family Faith Bag filled with goodies that can be used to do Bible storytelling activities together as a family, beginning September 13. This month we will learn the story of Joseph! We know you will be busy getting into the rhythm of the new school year so these activities will not overwhelm. They promise to be fun and engaging, creative and bring meaning to some familiar Bible stories for kids and their families, grades preschool-5th grade. If your child attended Sunday school last year they will get a bag delivered. If you did not attend Sunday school but would like to receive a bag, let Jenny know at education@brecksvilleumc.com. New bags will be delivered at the end of each month for the upcoming month's story. There is no cost associated with receiving a Family Faith bags. Cost for materials comes from the donations you make to the church through your regular weekly offering. I am so excited to see how we grow in faith together this year! Trust that you will be great at learning and growing closer to God together!
- Youth Group. Dana is so excited to welcome 6-12th grade students (college age is invited, as well) to join her on Sundays at 7 pm on Zoom for virtual youth group! We will focus on discipleship, building community, having deeper faith discussions, and we'll fit in some fun here and there, too! We will also have devotions on Instagram each Wednesday, follow us at @bumcyouthmin for a look into scripture and personal spiritual practice. It's going to be a good fall season and Dana can't wait to connect with you!


#### Lectio Divina -- New Day and Time Added

#### Living a Life of Non-Violence (accountability group)

When he founded the Methodist movement, John Wesley summarized his movement by telling people to do no harm, do good, and stay in love with God. Wesley not only centered how Jesus lived (disciplined non-violence), he also called on Reformist Christians to reconsider official Church doctrines and reprioritize how to live The Way of Jesus. What is this Way? Our fully divine, fully human prophet centers our love of God and faith by doing no harm and doing good. This accountability group is designed to explore the life of Jesus as a model of nonviolent resistance. This group will deepen our individual and collective spiritual growth by praying, meditating, studying, reading, reflecting, acting, and living our life rooted in a nonviolent ethic. In addition to considering Jesus in this light, we will also read and explore other models for living a nonviolent ethic such as Gandhi, Martin Luther King Jr., and other people who connect and emulate Jesus as the original nonviolent resistor. This group will consider adopting this way of life by working and socializing together. In short, this is a way of deepening one's spirituality by exploring how to live nonviolently in societies, states and a world that seems consumed by violence. Join us for an informational meeting via Zoom on Thursday, September 10 at 6 pm. We will discuss the best time to meet for the group at that gathering.

We are continuing the history of the Women's Society leading up to United Methodist Women's Group. Here are some excerpts from "The Church by Chippewa Creek, A History of the Methodist People of Brecksville 1823 - 1998" by William F. Long.

The Women's Society of Christian Service On September 7, 1940, the Ladies Aid Society was changed to Women's Society of Christian Service, and a new set of rules was approved. Dr. Brown, the speaker that day, suggested that a scroll be made containing the charter women's names. There were 45 names on the scroll, and Doris Wadsworth is the only one living charter member in 1998. During the 1940s, the WSCS engaged in many community-building activities. The members bought gifts and sponsored parties for the girls at the Blossom Hill School, attended plays as a group to provide a diversion from their routine duties and supported a theatre group for children, which Virginia Klein founded.

In 1957 Aileen Benninghoff, a local book reviewer and church member, gave a program on "The Life of John Wesley" and presented a Wesley Tea Service, bought in England, to the women's group. The big surprise came in 1958 when two friendship quilts were designed and made by members of WSCS for the Amendts' (Rev. Charles Amendt) 39th wedding anniversary. Each church member had paid 25 cents to have his or her name embroidered and appliqued on the quilts. In November, the surprise potluck supper was held, and the WSCS presented the quilts to the Amendts.

At the 150th anniversary of Brecksville in July, 1962, Betty Klein and her busy crew served several hundred barbecued beef sandwiches and gallons of iced tea. In 1969 WSCS bought drapes and chairs for the parlor. This was the last project of the WSCS because, with the church merger with the Evangelical United Brethren of 1968, the organization's name was changed to the UNITED METHODIST WOMEN.




## Open Doors. Welcoming all of God's children.

**Camphor Mission Says Thank You!** The Covid-19 pandemic has affected us all. Have you – or someone you love – lost employment? Lost income? Waited too long for unemployment benefits to arrive? Covered pressing bills with the stimulus check? Felt isolated, alone, unsure of what to expect?

Our brothers and sisters at Camphor Mission in Liberia have endured similar struggles and challenges – but without the unemployment benefits; without the stimulus checks. Liberian schools closed in March, and that meant teachers and other staff stopped being paid. But families still need to eat, and some of them still need to pay rent, others need medical care.

Here at Brecksville UMC our Missions and Outreach Committee authorized \$2,000 for salary support at Camphor Mission. That represents a little less than half the amount needed to pay the entire staff for one month. Other friends and supporters from the East Ohio Conference and other conferences in the US also provided some support. It took a while for the funds to reach their destination, but they have finally arrived!
