

#### THE LIGHT AT THE END OF THE TUNNEL

It's been one year since we have been out of the building for worship and many other things. (It boggles my mind that the weekend before the world shut down, we were crammed in the Fellowship Hall for "Music with a Mission!")

As COVID-19 case numbers decrease, and more and more people are being vaccinated, the light at the end of the tunnel is getting brighter: we will be able to gather together for in-person worship soon! I wish I had a crystal ball and could tell you exactly when that will be; but alas, God did not give me that gift. What I do know is that our staff has been working diligently on re-gathering plans. So when the Cuyahoga County health alert changes to "orange," we will have regular worship outdoors; and as soon as we hit "yellow," we'll be ready to greet you indoors! We have learned and grown so much this past year, and we do not want to lose our momentum. We're working on ways to integrate our online worship with in-person worship (aka "hybrid worship") so that those online still feel as connected as they do now. We are also working with medical professionals to keep apprised of best practices for in-person worship.

In the meantime, we have special outdoor worship services planned:

On March 7, we will resume parking lot communion services at 11 am.

Easter Sunday, April 4, we will have a sunrise service on our front lawn at 7 am (with Holy Communion!)

We are working to equip Fellowship

Hall to be another worship space, so we can welcome more people.

I know you are anxiously awaiting the Sunday when we can finally gather in our sanctuary together. Please know that I, too, am shouting, "How long, O Lord?"

Until then, though, I know that we are called to be the sanctuary out in the world: day to day, we are each a holy and sacred refuge where those who are broken and hurting can encounter God's love.

And I pray that we never stop doing that. I pray that we never forget the lessons we've learned in this time physically apart from one another. And I'm confident that when we come back together as a church community, we will be stronger than ever! Take Care,

#### **Missions & Outreach Looks Back at 2020**

2020 was an amazing year. Our church family was able to reach out and help others in so many ways. Here are some of them:

- Food Pantry Support—Monetary, Non-Perishables and Volunteers
- Rise Against Hunger—Packaging meals for the developing world
- Salvation Army Bell Ringing—Raising funds for neighbors in need
- Backpack and School Supply Drive—250 Backpacks and well over \$1500 in School supplies delivered to Corner 65 of Nehemiah Mission, Parma Heights Food Pantry and The Emergency Assistance Center
- Nordonia Hills Meals and Wheels—Drivers delivering meals to seniors
- **Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity**—\$5K to help fund a home, and hands to help build it.
- Thanksgiving Offering—\$2,400 for UMCOR US Disaster Response and Recovery
- **Drive In Nativity Pageant**—Financial support for this special outreach ministry.
- Christmas Offering—\$2,606 for Greater Cleveland Food Bank and the Teach\*Reach\*Bless Initiative for Africa University.
- Hat & Mitten Tree— 30 pairs of socks, 170 face masks, 76 scarves, 80 hats, 77 mittens/gloves, 91 hat & mitten sets for Centers for Families & Children (formerly WESEM), LGBTQ Connection of Cleveland and LeBron James Foundation (Akron City Schools). Each place received 2 trash bags full of items!
- Housing Assistance—With extra money we had, we saved 4 families from eviction at the end of 2020 through a donation to The Nazareth Housing Development Corporation.

#### Clothing collection for The Jesus Closet at Marymount Hospital

Everyday, patients are brought into hospitals with clothing that is soaked with blood or with injuries so severe that their clothing must be removed with scissors. Sometimes, the clothes must be kept as evidence of crime.

When these patients have no family of friends to bring fresh clothing to them upon discharge, workers at Marymount Hospital rely on donations from **The Jesus Closet** to help.

Right now, the Jesus Closet is virtually empty and the need for clean, gently used adult clothing is great. Our Missions and Outreach

Committee is organizing a drive to fill the closet—from March 7 to 28. Clothing in all sizes and for both men and women are needed.

Bring your gently used and clean clothes such as sweatpants, jeans and khakis, t-shirts, sweatshirts, jackets and coats, shoes and boots. New underwear and socks are also needed.



Sisterhood fosters a belief in girls' self-worth based on their skills, unique talents, and spirituality rather than on appearance, popularity, sexuality or negative gender and racial stereotypes and the program encourages and challenges young women to be strong and independent, to exercise selfdiscipline, to respect themselves and one another, to value education, and to know when and how to give help and receive it.

Girls participate in a range of cultural, educational and social programs throughout the school year. These programs aim to provide girls with the skills they need to maintain high self-esteem and reach future success.

#### **Lectio for Lent**

Lectio Divina (sacred reading) is an ancient method of reading scripture that allows us to meditate on a passage and contemplate its meaning in our life. Palms and Palm Crosses If you received a Lent Kit, you received a palm cross—to be used as a prayer prompt as you invite your friends to join us for Easter Services. These crosses were hand-woven by villagers near Masasi, Tanzania and are made from the dried leaves of the dwarf palm. Our purchase of the palms supports clean water,

**Eco Palms** The palms we wave for our palm parades (at home or in the church parking lot) will be harvested from the forests of Mexico and Guatemala through the Eco-Palm Project. The use of palm fronds on Palm Sunday creates a large demand, but conventional palm harvesting harms the environment as more fronds are cut than necessary. Eco-Palm harvesters, by contrast, incorporate better environmental techniques. More money goes to those who harvest them, and their communities flourish as a result. Learn more with this video.

#### **A Technicolor of Faith Voices**

Leaning into the Power of Story in Youth Ministry

I was scrolling on Instagram after dinner one night and I came across a brightly colored advertisement for a book. You don't see that often, a physical, hardbound book with a beautiful cover being advertised on social media, so I clicked it and I was pleasantly surprised at what I



found. I was being introduced to a book all about people throughout history who were movers and shakers in their faith communities. There were all different races, religions, sexialities, nationalities, and times in history among the profiles being featured. I was blown away that such a book even existed, let alone that I had quite literally stumbled upon it randomly on the internet. The book is called *Holy Troublemakers & Unconventional Saints* by Daneen Akers.

As I looked more into the book, I learned that the author is a mother who was dismayed to find out that her children's education was lacking quite a bit of diversity, in and out of school. So she took it upon herself to write a book that profiled an extremely diverse group of people who stood for love, justice, and caring for one another. Akers writes how she deeply believes in "the power of stories" and how those stories shape the narrative our children make for themselves. The heroes of the stories we tell matter and they can paint a world-view for our families in brilliant technicolor, if we let them.

The more voices we can add to the conversation of faith, the more our students can see a detailed picture of what their own faith could look like. That is why in April, as a part of our youth group program, we will be exploring *Holy Troublemakers & Unconventional Saints* and the beautiful people that are featured within the covers. Students can sign up for a delivery of an at-home kit that includes the book, activities to do during youth group, and other ways to engage in learning at home. Signing up is not necessary to join us for youth group, as lessons will be for any student to feel connected to the profiles we will feature. My hope is that students come away from each youth group session with a more expansive view of what it looks like to be a person of faith and how they can be holy troublemakers themselves.

# FINANCE REPORT


#### **MARCH 2021**

2021 started off on the right foot as the Stewardship Campaign was a great success. We received 118 commitments this year for a total of \$410,793! Our average pledge has increased by 4% over last year. Additionally, we received 54 commitments to our Planned Expense Fund for \$26,409 and a Missions commitment for \$5,000.

As the campaign kicked off in the fall, the Finance Committee started putting together a budget. This process starts in October with the intention to have final approval by Church Council in January. Budgeting during a pandemic is incredibly difficult, as we all know! There are many "what if?" scenarios that were discussed at length.

Church Council approved our 2021 budget with the caveat that it will be a working document subject to change if necessary. Our aim is to increase revenues with the hope that our building will become busier as the year progresses. If and when that happens, we do expect our expenses to increase as well. The pie chart pictured at right illustrates what we foresee our expenses to be.

We are facing a \$30k deficit, but by the grace of God, You, and our forgivable PPP Loan, we anticipate that we will end the year in a positive way, just as we did in 2020.
