#### **Restart: Relationships**

Brecksville UMC's mission of *creating safe spaces to grow with God and one another* is all about relationships: with God, with ourselves, with others, and with our resources. Everyone is welcome (and encouraged!) to participate in the life of Brecksville United Methodist Church. Members and first-time guests alike are welcome to participate in just about every aspect of our church community. When people first begin attending church, they usually ask themselves, "What can I get out of this church?" or "How can this church serve me or help me?" Important questions as one discerns whether a church is a good "fit" as a place they can grow and serve! As we become more involved and grow as disciples, the questions change to "What can I do for God through this church?" and "How can I help this church reach more people with the Good News of Jesus?" This will be followed by **Basic Beliefs**, a 4-week class focused on learning the basics of faith through a United Methodist lens (in February.) **The Membership Class** is the final step, and focuses on what it means to be a discipling, active member of Brecksville UMC (March 2022.)

You may take as long or as short as you would like to make your way through this Membership Journey. Upon completion, you will decide if you would like to become a member of BUMC and affirm that during worship.

#### You Can Help Make the "Nevers" Possible

"You'll never be able to attend a concert. You'll never be able to join a club. You'll never be able to attend a worship service." People with sensory sensitivity face obstacles to participating in activities others consider ordinary. By learning how we can help remove those barriers, we can create a more inclusive world for those with invisible disabilities.

Our church has partnered with Kulture City to bring their sensory inclusive training to Brecksville. The program is designed to help those with sensory needs like PTSD, autism, dementia, and strokes (just to name a few), feel welcomed and safe. The training is part of a program that includes sensory bags, signage, and sensory friendly spaces at the church.

It's another way we're creating safe spaces to grow with God and one another.

This is our third year in partnership with Kulture City and we are encouraging *everyone* to take part in the online training. Your friends are welcome, too! If you went through the training before, you just need a refresher. You can complete the training from home and you can do it anytime!

#### What's My Why?

Jen Speith's Reflection on Giving

My name is Jen Spieth and I am a newer member of our church, having joined BUMC in 2017. Pastor Heidi asked me to share with you why my husband and I give. When Pastor Heidi asked the question, I had to admit that I don't often think about it, but I had several initial thoughts. Because it's the right thing to do. Because my parents gave, and that's how we were raised. Because it feels good. But, when I thought about it some more, specifically the way she asked – *What is my why in giving to our church?*" – I sat with the question a bit longer.

"Thoughts" usually come to me in images and feelings. So I was flooded with images and feelings of times spent in and with this church. Here are the images I see and the feelings I feel when I think of my "why:"

The smell of extinguished candles and the hush that follows when we all sing the last note of Silent Night on Christmas Eve; and that feeling of quiet hope. The boisterous sounds of hammers hammering and laughter emanating from the fellowship hall during The Birdhouse Build. The smell of food, naturally - baked goods and pies, potluck goodies and chili - and the sounds of coffee cups clinking, conversations humming during Coffee Hours, Chili Cook Offs, Fall Kick Offs and other Joyful Gatherings; and the sense of belonging. The clunking of frozen food being sorted and boxes being loaded onto pallets at the Cleveland Foodbank; and the feeling of teamwork. The sound of shuffling socks walking on the printed path of the prayer labyrinth in the chapel during advent and lent seasons; and the feeling of security and openness. It's the contemplative silence that is bookended by Jenny's voice as she reads scripture and by the thoughtful sharing of experiences by those who participate in Lectio Divina; and feeling curious and inspired. It's the background sights and sounds of the sanctuary during worship. 20 or so months ago, that included whispered greetings between friends in Gary Mates' pew, watching turkey vultures perch and take flight through the windows, the pounding of little feet running up for the Children's Moment; and the feeling of unity. Nowadays, the sights and sounds have changed somewhat for me as I am attending Sunday services primarily online something that couldn't have been done if we weren't all giving to and through our church. So now it's the sound of my husband quietly sipping coffee, the realtime projection of online worship on our kitchen TV, the sound of my warbled and offkey singing that gets the dogs howling; and still the feeling of unity with you, my church family. These are the images and feelings I have of our church living its values.

So what is my "why?" It's an invitation. From God, who invites me to give through the many opportunities provided by and through BUMC – whether that gift is time, energy, presence, knowledge or money. Our church needs all of these forms of giving.

Our mission in creating safe spaces to grow with God and one another. I mean, that's cool. Through BUMC, God's invited us on this mission. Together! Which leads to... Our church family – past, present, future, near, far. So, the invite and the mission don't go far without our church family. This is why I give. Simply put: my why is YOU.





# **Your Gifts Make Ministry Possible**

#### **CASH GIFTS**

A cash gift in any amount is a convenient and popular way to show your faithful support for the church or other ministries. The full amount of your gift qualifies for a 2021 charitable income tax deduction - up to 50% of your adjusted gross income. (Make certain your check is dated 2021 and received no later than December 31, 2021, to receive a deduction for the year.)

#### GIVING & RETAINING INCOME FOR LIFE

Did you know you can give to a charity while retaining income from the gift for the rest of your life? A charitable gift annuity or charitable remainder trust enables you to receive flexible or guaranteed income. Plus, there are significant tax advantages. Let's assume you are 70 years old, single, and wish to make a \$10,000 gift to the church when you are gone but need to receive income until then. You can make the gift now and receive several attractive benefits. First, you could receive income that exceeds what you are currently earning on the \$10,000. At age 70 with an annuity rate of 4.7%\* of the \$10,000 each year through a gift annuity (\$470) - greater than most bonds or C.D.s. Next, a portion of the \$470 annual annuity may be tax-free over your life expectancy. Finally, you could receive a 2021 charitable income tax deduction for the remainder portion of your gift. This deduction can save you a sizable amount in federal income taxes. Making a life income gift now offers all these advantages and provides the satisfaction of knowing you have helped your church or charitable organization in a significant way. # GIVING UNNEEDED LIFE INSURANCE

Do you own an old life insurance policy that is no longer needed? Perhaps the purpose for the policy no longer exists (your children are grown or your mortgage is paid off) or your financial situation has changed and mitigates the need for the insurance. Consider giving the policy to the church or a charity and receive a charitable income tax deduction for the lesser of your cost basis or the replacement value. This is a great way to benefit a cause you support without reducing your checking account. If the value is more than you wish to donate, consider cashing in the policy and giving a lesser portion. Your gift may sufficiently reduce or eliminate any potential taxes due from the sale.

#### **MEMORIAL GIFTS**

As you think of those special people (a teacher, pastor, relative or other loved one) who have touched your life, you may want to do something "just right" to demonstrate that they are remembered. A memorial tribute can be a satisfying way to salute those whose memories continue to enrich our lives.
