On Planting, Pruning, and Lighthouses

I am a plant lady. A quick count gets me over 50 houseplants, plus my flower and vegetable gardens.

Most of my plants come from the clearance shelf at Lowe's. I bring them home, trim off the brown and dying stems and leaves, give them a little fertilizer, and make sure they have enough water, the right size pot, and enough sun.

Then I sit back and let the plants do their thing.

After a few weeks/months (depending on the plant), I notice new growth, and I dote over them: "Look at you! Look at your new leaves! And this new branch! You're so beautiful!" My friend told me the other day that I sound like I'm talking to a baby when I talk to my plants... which is probably why they grow so well.

But when I think back at how they looked when I got them—sad, brown, brittle, and in need of loving-care, I am proud of how far they've grown!

I thought about this process as I reflected upon Annual Conference, which was held June 8-10. At Conference, we voted on the disaffiliation of 237 churches in the East Ohio Conference. These are churches who chose to separate themselves from The United Methodist Church due to issues related to human sexuality.

We had known this day was coming. I have written about disaffiliation in past newsletters, had many conversations with individuals, and watched as churches and colleagues went through the discernment process of disaffiliation.

But seeing that number and the list of churches, voting on the disaffiliations, and praying over them—that made it real... final. As of July 1, 2023, 237 of the 651 churches in East Ohio—1/3 of the churches—will no longer be United Methodist. It's heartbreaking.

51% of the churches disaffiliating have an average worship attendance of 25 or fewer; 95% of the churches have an average of less than 100 people in worship. I don't point this out to say that these churches "don't matter as much;" I point it out because they obviously weren't flourishing in The United Methodist Church. They were doing fine, but not flourishing.

I think about when I propagate a plant—I trim off a stem and place it in a cup of water. Eventually, the stem begins to sprout roots, and then I place it in soil and it grows into a healthy, new plant. I pray that's what happens with the churches that have disaffiliated—that they will be able to grow into the Christian community God calls them to be.

Then I think about a plant when I've cut back 1/3 of its leaves and stems. It's not the same plant it once was—it's smaller, more fragile. And yet, over time, new stems and leaves begin to grow, and the plant begins to flourish—even better than it was before.

Yes, we mourn the loss of these churches of United Methodist siblings. And at the same time, we can be confident that if we continue to attune ourselves with God, God will use this as an opportunity to bring new life to The United Methodist Church.

One way new life is already budding is through Lighthouse churches. These are congregations in the East Ohio Conference who are deeply committed to The United Methodist Church, who are hospitable to guests, and who are already excellent in so many ways. These churches have committed to a series of trainings on hospitality, moving a guest to fully-welcomed members of the faith community, leading through change with grief therapy tools, and more.

I'm happy to share that Brecksville United Methodist Church is being cultivated as a Lighthouse church. It is a way that we feel God is calling us to live deeper into our mission of creating safe spaces to grow with God and one another. As we begin our training at the end of July, we will learn how to grow in our values of courageous inclusion, honest worship, and joyful gathering, and welcome those individuals who desire to remain United Methodist even though their church left the denomination.

I invite you to join with me in praying for those who have chosen to leave The United Methodist Church, as well as those who have chosen to stay. We know that God is much bigger than one individual, church, or denomination. And that if we remain rooted in God, God will lead us to the incredible things we haven't even imagined yet!

Annual Conference Recap

"Our mission is yet alive," declared Bishop Malone during her Episcopal Address. "Now is the time for us to focus forward. This is a time of remarkable opportunity in the life of The United Methodist Church." The 54th session of the East Ohio Annual Conference met June 8-10 at the John S. Knight Center in Akron. Annual Conference members:

- approved re-districting the East Ohio Conference from 10 districts to four districts effective January 1, 2024,
- approved a 5% increase across all pastoral minimum salary categories,
- approved the 2024 Conference budget of \$9,428,531, which is a reduction of 3.5% from the 2023 budget,
- approved the disaffiliation agreements of 237 churches effective the end of June 2023, and
- approved three resolutions.

The services and celebrations of Annual Conference 2023 commemorated 48 saints who joined the Church Triumphant since last year's conference; commissioned five clergy as provisional members and ordained nine clergy as full members; and celebrated the ministries of 40 clergy who are retiring this year. Vacation Bible School: Changemakers

The theme of VBS this year is called Changemakers and each day we will hear a Bible story that tells us about folks in the Bible that asked hard questions, worked well with each other and dreamed big dreams that resulted in changing (at least their corner of) the world a little bit. Summer Sprouts

Throughout the school year our kids run up the aisle after Children's Moment to attend Sprouts, a multi-aged group that learns together in our 4th floor classrooms. During those months when school is in session we learn Bible stories and how those stories connect to our lives today. Once the warm weather hits Sprouts changes a bit. Have you been wondering what we are doing as we all run up the aisle and head outside??

So far we have focused on what a big, beautiful and intricate world God has created. We use our listening skills as we sit still for a few minutes to hear and observe what is happening around us. Some of the kids are beginning to discern the difference between various bird calls!! We have learned about air, water, sun and soil and how living things use these to thrive and survive. Over the course of the summer we will continue to 'dig' in and learn about plants, mammals, birds, herps, fossils and insects. We occasionally go on short hikes and do scavenger hunts. Everything we talk about is tied back to what an amazing and creative God we have! I know from my own memories of childhood, what a huge impact it was for me to be encouraged to stop, and take the time to observe the intricacies of a blooming flower or the variety of creek insects I found. I hope that our kids gain an even greater appreciation for our natural world through summer Sprouts and a realization about what a gift God has given us in the creation around us!

What is ReachOut Camp?

For over 50 years, Reach Out has been an East Ohio United Methodist summer camp that aims to inspire youth to live a life of service and Christ-like love. During the week of camp youth have the opportunity to enjoy the gorgeous views of Lakeside, OH and have an overnight experience at a local missions location that Reach Out has partnered with in order to make a difference in the community. Over the course of the week, youth engage in worship, crafts, Bible study, swimming, fishing, shopping, games, and more. Reach Out is a unique experience that youth can only have at camp. Reach Out is truly a camp for teens by teens. It is led by seven high school juniors and seniors. They are elected each year by their fellow campers to plan the camp for the following year. The planning committee, or "PC's" are these seven youth. PC's lead prayers, worship services, large group games, devotions and other various activities throughout the week of camp. This allows campers to see their peers in a leadership position and sharing in their faith. For several years, Dana Schwendeman has written the study for Reach Out, led craft time, and participated as a staff member and Jamie Schwendeman has been part of the planning committee, played in the Reach Out worship band, and been a staff member. We have had some terrific BUMC youth attend Reach Out, getting to experience this awesome camp for themselves.

Great news! Brecksville UMC is one of several mission locations for this year and we will host a breakout group of Reach Out youth and their adult leaders. This group will spend some of their mission time at Trials for Hope and some of their time with our very own Bike Ministry. Between their two service opportunities they will stay the night at our church and have fun exploring the Brecksville area. What is the Simplified Accountability Structure?

As our church continues discussion about SAS (the Simplified Accountable Structure) we have pulled together resources on these two pages to help with our discernment and decision making.

Background

- The Simplified, Accountable Structure (SAS) takes the 4 of the committees required by the *Book of Discipline* (Finance/Trustees/Staff Parish Relations/Council) and merges them into 1 nine-member Leadership Board (plus the pastor)
 - Leadership Board is accountable for Brecksville UMC's vision/mission/goals
 - Leaders serve a rotating 3-year term, are formally nominated, and approved by Brecksville UMC at Charge Conference
- Other committees can transition to Ministry Teams (leaders/members not formally nominated, but can still be invited)
 - Ministry Teams are accountable for carrying out the mission within the guidelines of the Guiding Principles
 - Opens the door to more volunteers to serve on Ministry Teams without 3-year term/monthly meetings
 - Each Ministry Team is supported by a staff member
- Guiding principles establish guidelines so everyone knows what they can and cannot do
- Brecksville UMC has been reviewing the SAS model since February 2022. Church Council approved a formal "discernment" process and the model has been shared/discussed in a number of settings including Town Halls on 4/12 and 5/10; coffee hour; small groups; Council meeting 4/11; and at committee meetings.

Timeline/Next Steps

June – Submit request to District Superintendent for approval to move forward with the SAS model.

July 11— Church Council Meeting. Decide if we want to move to a vote on the model and choose the date for a church conference for the vote.

July – Church Conference, where all members of Brecksville UMC have the opportunity to vote, in person, on whether to approve the SAS model.

August – Selection/training of the Nominating Committee members

October - Selection of the Leadership Board

November - Training of the Leadership Board

January 2024 – Begin implementation of the SAS governance model

Frequently Asked Questions about the Simplified Accountability Structure

Q: Will volunteers step forward to assist with Ministry Teams without a nomination process?

A: Through a combination of church members being invited to participate in or lead Ministry Teams and church members stepping forward to volunteer, we are optimistic that we can engage more people in the mission of Brecksville United Methodist Church.

Q: Will the overall number of meetings really be reduced?

A: The only group that will be required to regularly meet is the Leadership Board. The work of the Ministry Teams will be determined by the individuals participating on those teams, and may include regular meetings, ad hoc meetings dictated by a particular project, or other means of communication.

Q: How do we ensure transparency/communication?

A: Portions of the Leadership Board meetings will be open for members to attend. Periodic Town Halls will be held for members to have a voice and engage in dialogue. Updates will be communicated in writing and during church announcements.

Q: Who holds the Leadership Board accountable?

A: Accountability will be addressed monitored similar to how Church Council and Committees are held accountable today.

- Members of the Leadership Board are formally nominated and trained in their role under the new model. This includes training on how to hold one another accountable.
- The Brecksville UMC congregation ultimately hold the Leadership Board accountable.
- The roles of the District Superintendent, Church Conference, and larger Methodist Church remain the same with regard to oversight/governance.
- The Ministry Teams are accountable to the Pastor/Staff leads.
- The Pastor is accountable to the Leadership Board and the Brecksville UMC congregation.

Q: Will we end up with a new model but the same problems?

A: Changing to the Simplified Accountable Structure is not just a change in structure, but a change in behavior.

Q: Has this model been successful in other churches?

A: Healthy churches that have adopted this model have been successful where:

- The change was well communicated and intentional
- The Nominating Committee and Leadership Board are formally trained
- The model is implemented as intended.

Q: What are the "Guiding Principles"?

A: The Guiding Principles are developed by the Leadership Board and establish the "macro" boundaries for authority for approval and decision-making. They are intended to be a permission giving tool to eliminate confusion and the need to wait on decisions and to remove barriers to ministry workflow.

Q: Does this mean we will be leaving The UMC?

A: No, a transition to the Simplified Accountable Structure only impacts the way we govern ourselves at Brecksville United Methodist Church. It does not in any way impact our relationship to the greater United Methodist Church. We will continue to #BeUMC!


