Among the 1,099 petitions submitted by members and groups of United Methodists around the world, GC delegates will vote on "three Rs:" removal of restrictive language regarding our LGBTQ siblings, regionalization, and revising our social principles. Any one of these would be a major change to The United Methodist Church. When brought together, however, they have the potential to transform the way United Methodist Churches are able to do ministry across the world.

Already, I've seen major media outlets picking up on the potential anxiety of General Conference, sharing stories about the "splintering" of The UMC causing financial instability, shrinking our global impact, etc. And I admit, if our goal as The United Methodist Church is to become the largest and most powerful church in the world, our future looks bleak. However: if our goal is to transform the world with God's love, mercy, and grace by making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, then our future looks pretty bright. Because I see people all across our United Methodist connection going back to the beginning, and remembering how The UMC started: as a movement.

The United Methodist Church began when John & Charles Wesley, along with a few of their friends, wanted their faith in Jesus to mean something. They didn't want to just go through the motions of "going to church," they wanted to live out their love of Jesus in the world. So, they began the "Holiness Club," meeting together to pray and study scripture, visiting those in prison, feeding the poor, and caring for the sick.

Their intention wasn't to start a new church—they just wanted to create a way (method) in which people who were part of The Church of England could grow in their love of Jesus and live out their faith.

That's what's actually important. Are we (to put it in BUMC terms) creating space to grow with God and one another? Are we equipping disciples to go out and create disciples and transform the world? (Wasn't that what Jesus' movement, thousands of years ago, was all about??) No matter the outcome of General Conference, if we keep our heart and passion focused on that, God will be glorified!

I encourage you to pray for the 862 delegates (half laypeople and half clergy) who are voting on the future of our United Methodist Church. May God's will be done through them.

Here at Brecksville UMC, we will continue to live our mission of creating safe spaces to grow with God and one another, and our values of honest worship, joyful gathering, lifelong learning, courageous inclusion, and determined service. And in the coming weeks and months, we will have opportunities to learn about if/how GC 2020 will impact our ministry.

Leadership Board Report

"How About A Salad Bar?"

Pastor Heidi asked that I share my perspective of being part of the current Leadership Board given my prior involvement serving on Staff Parish, Finance, Trustees and Church Counsel. (Yes, I have a hard time saying "no!")

When I first heard about the Simplified Accountability Structure and rolling the four committees into one Leadership Board model, I was intrigued. I wasn't concerned the work and responsibilities of each committee would be at risk. The concept of dedicated and empowered ministry teams sounded brilliant.

While I had great experiences on each of the individual committees, and formed deep and meaningful friendships through them, at times I felt something was lacking. I mean, we always did the work and when there was a need to have a longer term view, we did. For me it felt that cross-functional collaboration and shared short and long term visioning was missing.

With our new structure, I feel a renewed sense of involvement and excitement about the church. I feel less like "I'm serving on a committee," but rather "I'm serving in a ministry."

We would love to have you join the open monthly meetings either virtually or in person. The enthusiasm and participation is unlike any prior committee experience I have had. You will see robust and thoughtful dialogue about developing vital statistics, empowering our staff, setting goals and supporting the work of the ministry teams.

And in true Methodist form, a healthy conversation about a luncheon theme. Deb Watkins and her salad bar concept was the big winner this month!

These goals were developed by the Leadership Board, building upon the work of last year's Staff Parish Relations Committee. They are ways that we can continue to intentionally live into our mission and values together. It is the work of the Leadership Board to set goals for our congregation and ministry teams to work towards. The goals should be measurable, and broad enough so that individuals and ministry teams can discern how they can best participate in them.

Short Term #1:

Transition to SAS Governance model. (This will continue to be our goal throughout 2023 as we work through the first full year with this governance structure.)

Long Term #1:

Develop a discipleship pathway and help 50 people take their next step in discipleship.

Long Term #2:

Establish new and deeper relationships with 100 people from our communities; listening to gain understanding, discovering new ideas, and letting people know we care.

Shopping Bags to Sleeping Mats

Recycling and Reusing to Help Our Neighbors

If you're not in the habit yet of bringing your reusable shopping bag to the market, you may find yourself with a collection of disposable shopping bags. Let's put those bags to good use!



We can turn those bags into PLARN (plastic yarn) and weave them into sleeping mats to help put an insulated barrier between those sleeping outside and the cold hard ground. The Missions & Community Engagement Committee has purchased two looms, which will arrive in mid-June. This summer, we will be looking for volunteers to help weave and create sleeping mats to be distributed through Trials for Hope! It takes hundreds of bags to make one mat. *Here's how you can help.*

- Save your CLEAN, DRY, EMPTY shopping bags. Small tears are OK.
- If you can, flatten and fold them.
- Bring them to the white collection bin in the donation station (first floor coat room.)
