

# A message from Pastor Heidi



When I was in my early 20s, I was looking for a part-time job to have while I finished my undergraduate degree. My (future) father-in-law, Ash, suggested I apply for a Youth Director position at a local United Methodist Church. My response: "I don't like working with youth." He asked, "Have you ever worked with youth?" When I reluctantly said, "… no…" he challenged me not to assume I wouldn't like it, but give it a try. "At the very least, apply and see if you get an interview."

Long story short, I got the job and learned that working with youth is one of my gifts and actually a great joy. Teenagers are imbued with a healthy dose of skepticism and can tell when someone isn't being authentic or all-together truthful. (And they're not afraid to call you on it, either!) They're often comfortable with asking questions and are open to learning different viewpoints (at least more so than most adults). And they don't take themselves too seriously, so they find my sarcasm and goofiness entertaining.

My years in youth ministry taught me important lessons about faith:

- "It's not all about you, Pastor Heidi!"
- Authenticity and openness will expand your faith, while certainty will stifle it.
- Spending time with someone is never a waste, and ice cream can always make a bad day better.

Years later, I took a Spiritual Gifts Inventory and learned that my gifts of wisdom and shepherding (combined with my personality and interests) are what make working with youth so life-giving for me. When I shared this with Ash, he said, "Yeah, I know. That's why I suggested you do it!"

Again and again, people tell me, "I want to grow in my faith but I just don't know what to do!" And while I would love to sit down with each and every person and help you figure that out, that's just not realistic. So, we've retooled this year's Spiritual Trail Guide to help you discern this for yourself!

In the pages of this guide, you'll find a link to a Spiritual Gifts Inventory, and information on how various gifts correspond to different ways of serving and growing as a disciple here at BUMC. Our dear Dana created most of these resources for our New Member class last year. But we want everyone—not just those who are members or becoming members—to learn how God created them with unique gifts to bring joy to themselves and others! If you take the inventory and find yourself going, "Hmm..." then give me a call—I'll use my gift of discernment to help!

## **Spiritual Direction**

Are you longing for a deeper connection with God or seeking clarity about where God is leading you? Spiritual direction offers a safe, sacred space for prayerful conversation. A spiritual director is a trained, compassionate listener who will walk alongside you on your journey—helping you notice God's presence and activity in your everyday life, and inviting you to reflect on your own responses. This ministry nurtures your prayer life, supports you through seasons of discernment, and encourages you to live fully into your calling as a follower of Jesus.

# Adult & Teen Faith Formation Groups

Our classes are intergenerational and foster mutual spiritual support, accountability, and growth in discipleship. These groups provide encouragement, a place for open discussion about faith, and a structure for watching over one another in love, ensuring no one is lost in the community and promoting the practice of holiness.



## The Daily Examen: Practicing Gratitude, Noticing God

Sundays, 9.14-10.19 at 9:30 am in the Chapel

More than just a study, this will be a practice—one we'll live out together over the course of the class. Each day, you'll be invited to pause and prayerfully reflect, noticing moments of joy, challenge, and God's quiet nudges. When we gather on Sundays, we'll share our experiences, encourage one another, and grow in our awareness of the sacred woven into our ordinary days



#### Podcast Class Sundays at 9:30

What might we discover when we explore our big questions through the lens of faith? Join this class as we listen to a selected podcast during the week, then gather to reflect, question, and seek where God might be leading us.



## **Lectio Divina** *Mondays at 10:30 am in the Chapel*

Each week, we rest with one passage of scripture—slowing down enough to truly listen. Through prayer and guided reflection, we'll open our minds to God and engage our holy imagination, picturing ourselves within these sacred stories. This gentle practice helps scripture come alive and invites us into a more personal, transformative encounter with God.



**Holy Hell Book Discussion** *Mondays at 7 pm September 22 - October 13* What if everything we thought we knew about Hell was wrong? We're continuing our discussion of <u>the book by Rev. Derek Kubilus</u> from last spring -but anyone can join at anytime!



Sacred Sound Bath Experience Friday, October 17 at 7 pm

Step away from the noise of everyday life and rest in the healing presence of sound. In this one-hour experience, you'll be surrounded by the soothing tones of crystal singing bowls, rainsticks, Koshi chimes, an ocean drum, and a resonant gong. These gentle, layered sounds invite your body to relax, your mind to quiet, and your spirit to open to God's peace. As you rest in the soundscape, you'll be encouraged to simply notice—how your breath slows, how your heart softens, how God's presence feels near. It's a time of centering prayer through sound, creating space for renewal and deep spiritual rest.



# The Membership Journey

The Christian faith was never intended to be a solo journey. Church membership is an expression of our faith in God, our desire to live as disciples of Jesus Christ, and commitment to join with our church community to keep the vows made at baptism. At Brecksville United Methodist Church we are unabashedly authentic in our lifelong quest to grow with God and learn with one another, with age appropriate opportunities for all ages. Our early childhood education programs are designed to meet children where they are and to develop sticky faith that will give kids a foundation for lifelong growth with God. Caring teachers and helpers make learning fun, with plenty of opportunities to develop lasting friendships.



#### The Wiggle Room

Kids are always welcome in our worship spaces, but The Wiggle Room is available as another option! Staffed from 8 am until noon on Sundays, it's a safe space for our little ones, infants and up. Each adult is background checked and mindful of allergies and other needs.



Seedlings & Sprouts After the Children's Moment of the 10:30 service Two wonderful ways for children to grow in faith and learn God's stories. SEEDLINGS is a gentle, "old-school" style class perfect for younger children and anyone who enjoys a quieter setting. Children will hear Bible stories, pray together, and enjoy simple, hands-on activities at an unhurried pace. Seedlings is for children of any age. SPROUTS is a lively, rotation-style class where we explore a Bible story for six weeks through different learning stations—science, cooking, storytelling, games, video, music, and crafts. This class is designed for older kids with more independence; children must be in 1st grade or older to join Sprouts. Whichever path you choose, your child will experience God's love, engage with scripture, and build lasting friendships!



## Sunday at the Movies - 9:30 am, Room 401

Grab some popcorn and pull up a seat—it's time to see where God shows up on the big screen! 
# **HONEST WORSHIP: Sundays at 8:30**

#### **Curious Church: Wondering Our Way Forward** 9.7 - 10.26
